An award to be proud of! The movement for slower speeds (of which Rod King/20's Plenty are acknowledged as key global influencers) was honoured with a <u>royal road safety award</u> for 30kmh/20mph activism from Prince Michael of Kent. It was presented to the Streets for Life #love30 campaign's co-organisers for marketing May's UN Road Safety Week (World Health Organization, FIA Foundation, YOURS - Youth for Road Safety and the Global Alliance of NGOs for Road Safety). The number of lives all of us have, and will, collectively save is huge. Well done everyone!

**Cornwall** is moving towards default 20mph. Falmouth/Penryn and Camelford will go 20mph to spearhead the exceptions process. Cornwall is run by Conservatives who put 20mph in their May manifesto. Congrats to 20's Plenty for Cornwall for effective activism. Ask your Conservative leaders to look to Cornwall. In an era of environmental concern and increased consideration of people and their welfare (COVID), 20mph is now increasingly seen as protecting and enhancing village/small-town life and a building block for community growth in shires rather than a block to it.

**In Kent**, the two 20mph town-wide trial schemes in Tonbridge and Faversham have been made permanent, opening the way for more 20mph schemes in Kent.

**Love 30kmh** talks are informal conversations between Rod King MBE (Campaign Director of 20's Plenty for Us) and leading minds on new urbanism, active travel and about the progress and politics of 20mph/30kmh globally. Watch Dr Sarah Jones, the Public Health expert who's influence in Wales has been immense here

In London, the <u>Vision Zero Action Plan Progress Report</u> has just been published with a particular focus on reducing vehicle speeds. By 2024, 220km of TfL roads will have a 20mph speed limit, up from 80km in 2020. Really encouraging, following on from progress in Wales and Scotland, is that TfL is asking the UK Government to collaborate on a pilot project to trial a 20mph **default** speed limit on all residential roads in London.

**In Wandsworth**, all roads (bar one) managed by Wandsworth Council are now 20mph.

University of Surrey research shows how lower traffic speeds increase walking and cycling.
