

My 'ABC Moment'

At the beginning of each of our meetings we focus on an 'ABC Moment' - one that has informed, entertained, educated and inspired us.

The ABC in general has always been a source of enlightenment, but for me it's radio which has been, overall, the richer and more thoughtful in content. Probably, like the little boy I've mentioned on another occasion, it's because the "pictures" are better.

That's not to say that TV isn't a great source of inspiration, information, and productive agitation. What would we do without the <u>Four Corners</u> investigations into nasty dark corners, and panels like <u>Q & A</u>, and <u>The Drum</u>, the science programs, and that consummate broadcaster Dr Ann Jones and her wonderful science programs about birds, and trees, and whales, and much more? Or <u>the Friday gardening programs</u>, and the recent <u>Australian Story about Sam Elsom</u> who gave up a very successful fashion design career to go to Tasmania to grow kelp to help reduce the toxic effects of carbon. And I loved the program about farmers involved in <u>regeneration farming</u>. We need inspirational people like these.

But the problem with this sort of personal appraisal is not what to say, but how to choose from so much which is so good, so life-affirming. It's mainly ABC radio which keeps me a rusted-on follower - The Naked Scientist from Cambridge University prevents me from going to sleep on Friday nights, and Big Ideas at about 3 in the morning can keep me thinking for weeks afterwards. As for Radio Classic - wonderful!

The ABC isn't perfect, or wholly satisfactory; sometimes it's very annoying. But what I really love is the easy availability of so many differing viewpoints on a non-commercial broadcaster. It's the dedicated people who participate in, and make the programs, who are, for me, the **real** value.

There are so many wonderful "ABC moments" to choose from, but I'd like to particularly mention the young Ethiopian/Sudanese refugee lawyer, now in Melbourne, who is often on the Drum. Her name is Nyadol Nyuon. Every word she says is worth listening to. Her humanity and wisdom, and her growing influence have already had a profound influence in this country, and for this she's received much recognition and many awards.

Equally impressive are the many First Nation broadcasters, both young and older, who present with great dignity, hope, and generosity, their plea for justice and equality, especially in the last difficult months. We <u>must</u> listen to what they have to say.

It's from people like all of these - Nyadol Nyuon, First Nation, and many others who strive for a better world - that I gain most of all from the ABC.






