

Re: 2024–25 Pre-Budget Submission

NSoS[1] appreciates the opportunity to make a submission to you. It requests that you address the funding shortfall to the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) in your budget deliberations. The cumulative impact of funding cuts, since 2014, continues to have devastating impacts on the ABC's capacity to provide quality public interest programs and fulfil its obligations under its Charter.

Democracies around the world are facing extraordinary threats from misinformation and disinformation from social media, commercial streaming services and media fragmentation. Democracies that have a strong, well-funded and independent public broadcaster are more resilient.

NSoS appreciates the Australian Government's commitment to the ABC with the immediate reversal of the \$83.7 million cuts and the implementation of fiveyear funding terms.

However, the ABC continues to be challenged and compromised by the cumulative impacts of funding cuts, especially those that began in 2014. Today the ABC currently has 10 per cent lower budget compared to 2013-2014.

NSoS asks that you restore the nearly \$1 billion cuts [2] to the ABC.

If the ABC's funding shortfall is not addressed NSoS fears dire consequences for Australia's future. Without restoring the cumulative impacts of the funding cuts, it is making it impossible for the ABC to increase the range and diversity of programs and reinstate lost services.

Australians need their ABC more than ever. It is a critical public service that must be valued and well funded. It is the bedrock of our democratic, cultural, artistic and educated society.

NSoS calls for the **restoration** of the cumulative cuts to the ABC and **additional funding** for it to fulfil its Charter in a rapidly changing world with heightened geopolitical tensions and increasing frequency of emergency climate disasters.

The case for strong and secure funding for our public broadcaster has never been more important.

My 'ABC Lifetime of Moments' by Charles Murray

At the beginning of each of our NSoS meeting a member shares their 'ABC Moment' - one that has informed, entertained, educated and inspired them. Here is what ABC friend and poet Charles Murray said at our last meeting:

As an immigrant, a new Australian, it began in the 1960's on The Snowy Mountains Scheme and was reinforced later in the early 1970's when I domiciled in Sydney and "WOULD YOU BELIEVE", a truth or lie TV Show about Australia and its history hosted by Peter Lazar and featuring such local identities as Cyril Pearl, Michael Baume, Frank Hardy, Noeline Brown and Len Evans, amongst other entertainment notables, made up two panels who vied in clever informed ways to disprove one another.

The late great and inimitable Caroline Jones, architect and pioneer in such influential shows as "THIS DAY TONIGHT", "FOUR CORNERS" and "AUSTRALIAN STORY" ... these were programmes of high integrity, truth-reporting, and disclosure ... informed my life positions, direction and opinions.

"THE BOOK CLUB" with Jennifer Byrne chairing an always vital panel on the Past, Present and Future of books and literature and where we met the authors amongst whom were giants such as Kennealy, West, Flanagan, Malouf, Hardy, the Heavy Hitters in Australian Literature! We were in great company, weren't we?

"ENOUGH ROPE" with the engaging and meticulous Andrew Denton whose revelations in interview sometimes surprised the famed interviewee ... people skills never ever lacking in respect.

The iconic "COMPASS" programme asking the big questions of Life and the Soul ... unmissable and respectful of all positions ... COMPASSION be thy name!

All these informed me, as did and does the following which also will assist in writing the Australian History of today "LATELINE", "LANDLINE", "BACKROADS", "AUSTRALIA ALL OVER".

All of the early Science Shows, before developing our own capabilities, were borrowed from UK TV (BBC) and the United States...I loved them..."The Sky at Night-Reaching for the Stars" presented by the irascible Sir Patrick Moore and then, Carl Sagan with his highly sophisticated American Science Program and his "Journey into the Cosmos"...these shows fascinated me and I am an afficionado of all our current shows involving the exceptional Professor Brian Cox on our ABC.

In 1916 Albert Einstein predicted the existence of gravitational waves, "ripples" in Spacetime caused by some of the most violent and energetic processes in the Universe and in 2016 on an ABC Science show, Brian Cox imparted the "news" that the "gravitational waves" after billions of light years of travel had "arrived" and had been detected for the first time on a scientific instrument developed and built in Europe, at a cost of billions of dollars...the sound of the "gravitational waves" arriving has been described as a gentle "chirrup"!

In 2016 I composed a poem to celebrate the event and which it is now my pleasure to perform for you, my fellow ABC Friends . . .

GRAVITATIONAL WAVE

by Charles Murray

We heard in wonderment the tale, a new infinity of scale,
of time, a gravitational wave, a billion light year sonic rave
as two black holes in pas de deux, stygian dervishes whirling through
the deepest space; man never knew of time as metronomic wave,




