Lani Rouillard is a lawyer from Sylvan Lake, Alberta, who established Rouillard Law Office in 2007, which has served Central Alberta for nearly 17 years.

"When I took my Oath as a lawyer in 2006, I promised to uphold the Rule of Law and my commitment to this Oath remains unchanged. The last 3 years prompted me into speaking roles and projects that educate the public regarding our diminishing state of law and personal freedoms. Although I have a litigation background, I normally practice corporate, commercial, wills and estates and real estate law. During the past few years, I have been advancing administrative tribunals and litigation against AHS, appeared as counsel at the POEC (Public Order Emergency Commission) in Ottawa and challenged the Alberta Human Rights Commission regarding their application of the law. I am also a proud member of Lawyers 4 Truth and the Alberta Lawyers Commission. I am committed to standing in my truth."



Eva Chipiuk has made a career representing David in the fight against Goliath. She represented landowner property rights against major energy developments and advocated individual Charter rights in challenges against the government. Eva became concerned about the loss of personal rights and freedoms of Canadians over the Covid pandemic and had an opportunity to work with a civil liberties

organization in Canada and represent the Honourable Brian Peckford in the federal travel ban challenge, and the Freedom Convoy in the inquiry into the circumstances for invoking the Emergencies Act against the protestors in Ottawa where she had the opportunity to cross-examine the Prime Minister of Canada.

Her newest venture, Empowered Canadians, is an organization focused on helping Canadians understand their legal and political systems so they can actively engage in their civic responsibilities and be more active members in democracy.

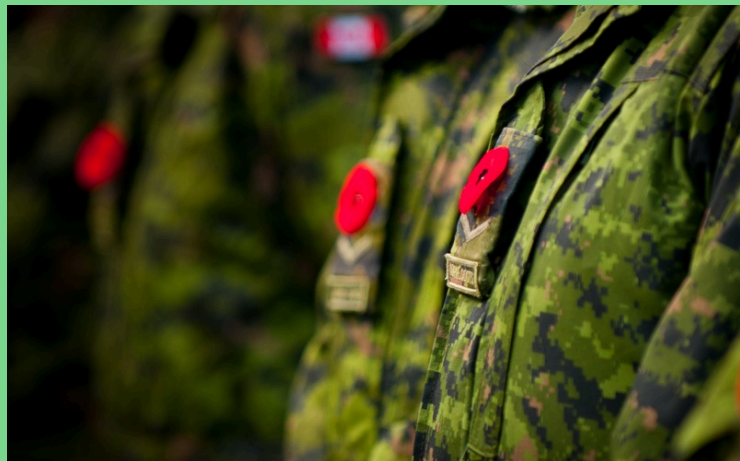
