ABOUT ACTION 4 LIBERTY

Action 4 Liberty's mission is to protect liberty for the next generation

ACTION 4 LIBERTY rates bills positively when they expand individual freedoms and reduce government control. We annotate a legislator's vote that are in agreement with our position as a "1". When a legislator votes in opposition to the freedom position, we mark the vote with a "0". If the legislator was absent or abstained from a vote, we annotate it with "A". Absences and abstentions affect legislators' scores. Legislators have an obligation to serve their constituents and failing to provide that representation results in a legislator receiving a "0" for that vote.

While the vast majority of absences are classified as "excused" by the body, even the best excuse leaves constituents without representation. There are also examples of politicians who are unwilling to take a position on tough votes and that should be reflected in their score. Behavior like absences and abstaining from votes should be discouraged.

Scores above 90% would be considered an "A" grade. We expect all Republicans to be at this level, which would represent a commitment to the conservative values they profess to have on the campaign trail. **Scores below 60% are failing grades.** It is important to note that a Democrat legislator might vote for our position on a given bill, not based on the same principles, but because it does not grow government enough or push a woke enough ideology. Surprised by the low scores on this scorecard? What differentiates our scorecard from other rating organizations (Washington D.C. based groups) is that we score omnibus bills. Other organizations purposely ignore those votes or other critical votes so they can boost the scores of poor voting Republicans. We feel it's critically important to score the bills that actually grow government by billions of dollar and reduce our freedoms.

LEGISLATIVE NOTES

THE 2023 MINNESOTA LEGISLATIVE SESSION has been arguably the worst session in our state's history in regards to the loss of our liberty with the largest budget passed in Minnesota history. Starting off with a massive budget surplus that could have been returned to taxpayers, lawmakers began negotiations that turned into a slap in the face to Minnesotans. Despite the fact that the \$21 Billion Surplus could have been divided for each taxpayer to receive over \$4,000, the final deal gave just \$260 per filer/dependent. A Surplus is the result of citizens being overtaxed because those dollars would've been appropriated in the previous budgets and session, since that did not take place the only fair thing to do is return it to those who paid in. **With Democrats in total control, anything that was getting across the finish line had their fingerprints all over it.** The best work conservative legislators could do was opposing the radical left agenda being put forward. Senators **Cal Bahr** (SD31), **Eric Lucero** (SD30), and **Nathan Wesenberg** (SD10) tied for the highest score in the Senate with a score of 95.45% while Representatives **Steve Jacob** (20B) and **Mike Weiner** (5B) tied for the highest score in the House with a

score of 90.91%. This session went from bad to worse after it was clear that taxpayers would not get the Surplus return they deserved. Our tax dollars were wasted throughout the session

on corrupt bonding bills, indoctrination/"education", free breakfast and lunch for all students, and projects for special interests and lobbyists. To make matters worse, the Legislature increased our taxes through the omnibus tax bill, metro sales tax bill, and the home delivery tax bill. This session has also given us unconstitutional, tyrannical gun control. Red flag laws, intrusive background checks, and firearm transfer regulations strip our citizens of our God given Right to bear arms. Our Right to free speech has also been trampled as a new database to track "bias" and "hate speech" said by Minnesota citizens. This infringement is coupled with the "Deep Fake" bill that makes it punishable with prison time if you create or share an AI image or video that "influences an election"; now memes are illegal in Minnesota. To wrap up the anti-freedom, morally bankrupt session, the Legislature made Minnesota a sanctuary state for child abuse by allowing a child of any age, without parental consent, to have their genitals mutilated and lose all sexual functions for life under the guise of changing their gender. To make matters worse, Democrats sided with pedophiles over children by striking language from the Minnesota Human Rights Act that clearly stated adults attracted to children is not a protected sexual identity in our state. In addition, the Legislature legalized abortions up to (and after) the moment of birth and removed state statutes that protect their lives. 2023 VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

NOTE: Legislation must adhere to all principles and tenets of the U.S. and Minnesota Constitutions. Action 4 Liberty holds legislation to high scrutiny and does not excuse votes that pass some supposedly “good” things and while simultaneously passing evil big government agenda items. Aside from big government politicians seeking to infringe on our Constitutional liberties like free speech or the right to bear arms, the most blatant violation of the Minnesota Constitution can be found in Article 4, Section 17 which reads “Sec. 17. Laws to embrace only one subject. No law shall embrace more than one subject, which shall be expressed in its title.” This has been abused by the MN Legislature and courts have allowed corrupt omnibus bills, which are sometimes hundreds or thousands of pages, to be enacted into law. Considering that omnibus bills are multi-subject by nature, this provision is worthy to note ahead of seeing our scored bills and our labeling of many as “unconstitutional”. Action 4 Liberty only supports legislation is single-subject and protects liberty or shrinks the size/scope of government while adhering with the U.S. and MN Constitution.

YOUR MONEY

HF1587 - Omnibus Agriculture Policy Bill

House Vote: 87-39 (4/20/23)

Senate Vote: 61-4 (4/26/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill compiled several areas of policy including further federal oversight and regulation on agriculture, removal of certain regulatory authorities from municipalities/localities, imposed new regulations, removed certain dairy regulations, and allowed out of state veterinarians to temporary work with the University of Minnesota. This bill additionally makes changes to clean up language in law and make changes to definitions. Overall, this bill is generally mundane and is mixed with policy that is positive, neutral, and negative. Each policy item should be decided as a stand alone bill and should not be thrown into a bill containing unrelated issues.

HF670 - Cash Bonding (Pet Project Spending)

House Vote: 74-43 (5/22/23)

Senate Vote: 35-14 (5/22/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill is a spending spree for politicians to dish out extra funding on the last day of the 2023 session for pet projects that politicians wanted included in the bonding (debt) bill. Though it is called “Cash Bonding bill”, it is truly just a pork-filled, multi-subject, unconstitutional spending bill. While some of the projects may sound uncontroversial or even beneficial, local communities should prioritize care for themselves instead requiring state funding from a bill spending hundreds of millions of tax dollars.

HF669 - Bonding (Debt) Bill

House Vote: 97-35 (5/22/23)

Senate Vote: 56-11 (5/22/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill is an unconstitutional massive spending bill totaling billions in debt for the state in order to fund politicians’ pet projects to campaign on. Wasteful spending is bad enough but this bill puts our state in debt because bonding bills allow the state to borrow money to serve special interests’ demands.

SF10 - Oil Refinery Labor Union Control

Senate Vote: 39-27 (4/17/23)

House Vote: 83-46 (4/24/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill required oil refineries only contract with labor unions and fires non-union oil refinery workers who are otherwise credentialed, skilled, and desired as employees. Corrupt union bosses have sunken their teeth into politicians and are working against the free market and individuals who work outside of the union boss model. This type of corruption works against the interests Minnesota by shrinking the candidate pool for businesses in specific lines of work like oil refineries.

HF2497 - Edu./Tampons in Boys Bathrooms

House Vote: 70-62 (5/16/23)

Senate Vote: 35-32 (5/16/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill is a massive, 335 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that allows school districts to offer free tampons in the boys bathrooms at schools by establishing a woke, nonsense policy that offers the product to all “menstruating students”! In addition, this is a multi-subject education spending bill that wastes billions of tax dollars.

HF5 - Free Lunch & Breakfast Schools Bill

House Vote: 71-54 (3/16/23)

Senate Vote: 38-26 (3/14/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill created the program that offers breakfast and lunch at schools for “free”/from taxpayers who likely do not have children in the public school system. This program went over-budget and has placed a burden on taxpayers for a problem with simpler and cheaper solutions. Unlike the system established beforehand, this is not a need-based program, which already served children in families with low income. Additionally, offering free breakfasts and lunches may mean schools are forced to choose quantity over quality in food selections.

HF1938 - Tax Finance and Policy Omnibus Bill

House Vote: 69-63 (5/20/23)

Senate Vote: 34-33 (5/21/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This is a massive 380 page omnibus tax bill that is multi-subject and unconstitutional. Notably, this bill decreases eligibility for the working families tax credit, increases property taxes temporarily, and makes pull tabs illegal. This bill serves as another example of politicians financially abusing taxpayers with tax rates that funds the government well beyond its Constitutional obligations.

2023 VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

YOUR RIGHTS

SF2909 - Public Safety Omnibus Bill

Senate Vote: 34-33 (5/12/23)

House Vote: 69-63 (5/15/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This was perhaps the most evil, unconstitutional legislation that has ever passed and been signed by a Minnesota Governor. This unconstitutional, multi-subject omnibus bill changed the Minnesota Human Rights Act to remove a sentence stating that the "sexual attachment of children by adults" was not a protected class opening up the door for future legal defenses of pedophilia! This bill also creates a hate speech database and spends hundreds of millions of tax dollars on funding for projects and courts. Additionally, this bill contains unconstitutional gun control provisions establishing universal background checks and red flag laws.

SF13 - Juneteenth Est. as State Holiday

Senate Vote: 57-8 (1/26/23)

House Vote: 126-1 (2/2/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill establishes June 19th (Juneteenth) as a recognized state holiday to commemorate the emancipation of slaves. As a state holiday, government employees are guaranteed another paid day with no work off of taxpayer dollars. Certain costs will be incurred school districts, courts, and other public institutions. Juneteenth became a federal holiday following George Floyd's death and has been used as a symbolic gesture to submit to the BLM movement.

SF37 - Equal Rights Am. to State Constitution

Senate Vote: 43-23 (5/17/23)

House Vote: 68-62 (5/18/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This legislation proposes an Amendment voted at the ballot box by the people that amends Minnesota's State Constitution to "guarantee equal rights" and block "discrimination" on the basis of race, color, national origin, ancestry, disability, sex, abortion, gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation. Beyond the woke garbage putting boys in girls locker rooms, this proposition is clearly against the concept of free market capitalism that allows individuals to freely decide their own business interactions. Fortunately, this bill was not taken up by the Senate to be re-passed and did not reach Minnesota ballots.

HF197 - Equal Rights Am. to U.S. Constitution

House Vote: 70-51 (5/19/23)

Senate Vote: 42-25 (5/17/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill demands Congress ratify the Equal Rights Amendment into the U.S. Constitution as the 28th Amendment. Unlike Minnesota's so-called Equal Rights Amendment, this version is limited and focuses only on discrimination based on sex. Unfortunately, the author of the Equal Rights Amendment written in 1923, Alice Paul's institute explicitly states their inclusivity to transgender, non-binary, and gender-nonconforming 'women' and creates unnecessary "protections". There are no Rights than men have that women do not have, the United States has no need for this Amendment to muddy and clog the legal system.

HF37 - Crown Act

House Vote: 111-19 (1/11/23)

Senate Vote: 45-19 (1/26/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill establishes new law in Minnesota that bans individuals from discriminating on the basis of hairstyles connected to race. This woke regulation will muddy and clog up the legal system with cases that don't belong in a public court. Specifically this bill bans discrimination based on hair texture and hairstyles like braids. This type of unnecessary woke regulation passed by members on both sides of the aisle signifies that many issues run beyond party lines.

HF30 - Catalytic Converter Overregulation

House Vote: 109-19 (3/9/23)

Senate Vote: 40-25 (3/2/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill attempts to stop catalytic converter thefts while over-regulating regular citizens with laws that criminals will not follow. This bill adds more mandated secretary workload to maintain receipts and records for metal scrappers and junkyards when in possession of a catalytic converter and establishes criminal penalties. This sloppy legislation will cause more harm to Minnesotans than the crime it will stop because crooked Judges and Prosecutors are the real reason criminals are stealing car parts, regulating common citizens does nothing to solve that issue.

THE CLIMATE

HF2040 - Carbon free/Blackout Bill

House Vote: 70-60 (1/26/23)

Senate Vote: 34-33 (2/2/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill is the climate cultist that imposes an impossible 2040 carbon free mandate on energy production which will lead to energy blackouts which may cause people to freeze and die in winter. This policy is further left than the 2060 carbon neutrality plan for Communist China. This bill additionally establishes "environmental justice areas" to gain certain privileges for being 40% or more non-white, 40% can't speak English, 35% in poverty, or in tribal lands. This bill requires all energy be carbon free by 2040 and 80% by just 2030. Additionally, this bill excludes or gives additional regulations for certain carbon free energy production beyond wind and solar.

HF1656 - Federal Energy Grants

House Vote: 83-47 (3/23/23)

Senate Vote: 39-22 (4/11/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill spends over \$100 Million on grants to pick winners and losers in the energy industry. This federal funding comes from so-called Inflation Reduction Act of 2022. Instead of a far-reaching grant program that gives authority to Executive branch to reward grants, the Legislative branch should be debating each funding issue on its own merit.

2023 VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

EXTREME SOCIAL ISSUES

HF1 - Codifying Post-Birth Abortions Bill

House Vote: 69-65 (1/19/23)

Senate Vote: 34-33 (1/27/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill codified that it is a Right in Minnesota for women to have abortions in all cases, without exception. There are no lines drawn to prevent late-term or even post-birth abortions and serves as a tool for radical left politicians to continue to fund abortion with tax dollars. This legislation is clearly immoral and contains nothing of benefit.

SF2995 - Abortion Repealer

Senate Vote: 34-32 (5/22/23)

House Vote: 69-64 (5/22/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill demands Congress ratify the Equal Rights Amendment into the U.S. Constitution as the 28th Amendment. Unlike Minnesota's so-called Equal Rights Amendment, this version is limited and focuses only on discrimination based on sex. HF146 - Sanctuary State for Genital Mutilation

House Vote: 68-62 (3/23/23)

Senate Vote: 34-30 (4/21/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill establishes Minnesota as a "sanctuary state" for genital mutilation surgeries and other transgender surgeries and procedures. This bill does not place any age limits on access to the associated drugs and surgeries and seeks to make Minnesota a refuge for transgenders, including confused children who've had this radical ideology forced onto them. This bill also prevents individuals from being charged with a crime for the involvement in transgender surgeries, operations, or other drugs and procedures.

HF4 - Drivers Licenses for Illegals

House Vote: 70-60 (3/2/23)

Senate Vote: 34-31 (2/21/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill allows illegal aliens to obtain drivers licenses in the state of Minnesota. These drivers licenses do not indicate that the licensed individual is illegally in the United States which makes things more difficult for police officers/ICE in deportation operations or election workers if an illegal alien is attempting to commit fraud by voting. In addition, this policy is a major incentive for illegal aliens to come to Minnesota, making our state less safe.

VOTING AND ELECTIONS

HF1830 - Electoral College / Spending Bill

House Vote: 69-62 (5/19/23)

Senate Vote: 34-31 (5/19/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill is a multi-subject, unconstitutional 300 page omnibus bill that funds the state government spending hundreds of millions of tax dollars to give Walz, Keith Ellison, and others in the Administration oversized budgets to waste. In addition to the out-of-control spending, this bill works to eliminate the Electoral College by having MN join other states that have voted to institute a national popular vote, loosens regulations on politicians requiring they reside in the district they represent, and increases requirements unfairly for major party status to maintain the duopoly (uniparty) and avoid competition.

HF3 - 16 year olds can register to vote

House Vote: 70-60 (1/26/23)

Senate Vote: 34-33 (2/2/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill is a multi-subject election bill that allows 16 year olds to register to vote, creates voting samples and voting instructions in languages other than English, funds multilingual election judges, and gives more money to the Attorney General and Secretary of State's offices. One regulation included in the bill prevents "foreign-influenced corporations" from donating to politicians or political causes.

HF1370 - Deep Fake Bill

House Vote: 131-0 (5/16/23)

Senate Vote: 66-1 (5/17/23)

CORRECT VOTE: NO

This bill is an anti-free speech bill that criminalizes the creation and sharing of artificial intelligence memes, pictures, or videos about politicians if it could "influence an election" and if it takes places 90 days of an election, without the permission of the individual depicted, and is meant to "injure" a candidate. Less controversially, this bill also outlaws unwanted intimate and sexual artificial intelligence pictures and videos.
