ABOUT ACTION 4 LIBERTY

Action 4 Liberty's mission is to protect liberty for the next generation

ACTION 4 LIBERTY rates bills positively when they expand individual freedoms and/or reduce government control and rates bills negatively when they erode individual freedoms and/or increase government control. We annotate a legislator's vote that are in agreement with our position as a "1". When a legislator votes in opposition to the freedom position, we mark the vote with a "0". If the legislator was absent or abstained from a vote, we annotate it with "A". Absences and abstentions affect legislators' scores. Legislators have an obligation to serve their constituents and failing to provide that representation, failure to do so results with that legislator receiving a "0" for that vote.

While the vast majority of absences are classified as "excused" by the body, even the best excuse leaves constituents without representation. There are also examples of politicians who are unwilling to take a position on tough votes and that should be reflected in their score. Behavior like absences and abstaining from votes should generally be discouraged. Since failing to take a vote is better than voting for big government, we score it in the middle.

We expect all Republicans to be at a 90% score or higher because that would illustrate that they have a commitment to the conservative values they profess to have on the campaign trail. Scores below 60% are failing grades. We separate the presentation of scores between Democrats and Republicans for several reasons. Democrat legislators generally do not profess the same belief in expanding individual freedoms and reducing government control as we do. Their scores can be somewhat misleading. A Democrat legislator might vote for our position on a bill, not based on the same principles, but because it does not grow government enough. Surprised by the low scores on this scorecard? What differentiates our scorecard from other rating organizations (Washington D.C. based groups) is that we score omnibus bills. Other organizations purposely ignore those votes so they can boost the scores of poor voting Republicans. We feel it's critically important to score the bills that actually grow government by billions of dollar and reduce our freedoms.

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LEGISLATIVE NOTES

THE 2024 MINNESOTA LEGISLATURE served as another example of out-of-control government spending of **YOUR** tax dollars and the erosion of **YOUR** God-given, Constitutional liberties. Our founding fathers envisioned a government limited to its core, essential duties, a concept our state has far strayed from.

The session culminated in chaos on its final day as both the House and Senate chambers erupted once Democrat House Speaker Melissa Hortman and Democrat Senate President Bobby Joe Champion ram-rodded unconstitutional, multi-subject legislation through while refusing to hear Republican points of order, inquiry, and other motions from the body.

Democrats contended that the corrupt omnibus legislation was necessary and had to pass before the legislative deadline, which they used to justify their refusal to recognize their GOP colleagues on the floor despite it being mandatory to do. Republican Representatives opted not to take a vote during these unconstitutional legislative actions. Democrats were assisted in this illegitimate stunt by so-called nonpartisan staff.

As usual, the St. Paul Swamp produced major corruption with little to be excited about. In all instances in this scorecard, a **(1)** will indicate that the legislator voted for the pro-liberty, small government position, an **(A)** will indicate that the legislator was

absent or abstained, and a **(0)** will indicate that the legislator voted for the anti-liberty, big government position. On four votes featured in the scorecard, we score abstained votes equally to “No” votes due to the legislature descending into chaos on the final day of session.

Senator **Cal Bahr** (SD31) received the highest score in the Senate with a score of 91.30% while Rep. **Steve Jacobs** (20B) and Rep. **Bryan Lawrence** (27B) tied for the highest score in the House with a score of 83.33%. Lawrence was sworn in following a special election as the legislature was already in session so he missed several votes we scored, which means Jacobs had the best voting record in the House for 2024. The lowest Republican score in the House is from Representatives Brian Daniels (19A) and Shane Hudella (41B) at 20.83% and Senator Jim Abeler (SD35) in the Senate with 26.09%.

All bills are summarized in the following pages and include the correct vote for the pro-liberty, small government position.

Use this scorecard as a tool to see which politicians have voted to protect our liberties and which have voted to throw them away.

2024 VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

CONSTITUTIONALITY NOTE: Legislation must adhere to all principles and tenets of the U.S. and Minnesota Constitutions. Action 4 Liberty holds legislation to high scrutiny and does not excuse votes that pass some “good” things and other bad things. Aside from big government politicians seeking to infringe on our Constitutional liberties like free speech or the right to bear arms, the most blatant violation of the Minnesota Constitution can be found in Article 4, Section 17 which reads “Sec. 17. Laws to embrace only one subject. No law shall embrace more than one subject, which shall be expressed in its title.” This has been abused by the MN Legislature and courts have allowed corrupt omnibus bills, which are sometimes hundreds or thousands of pages, to be enacted into law. Considering that omnibus bills are multi-subject by nature, this provision is worthwhile noting ahead of seeing our scored bills and our labeling of many as “unconstitutional”. Action 4 Liberty only supports legislation is single-subject and protects liberty or shrinks the size/scope of government while adhering with the U.S. and MN Constitution.

BILLS

SF4942 - Omnibus Prime

House Vote: 70-11 (5/19/24)

Senate Vote: 36-31 (5/19/24)

CORRECT VOTE: NO/ABSTAIN

This bill is a 218 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that spends hundreds of millions of taxpayer dollars, adds new regulations, and served as a giant wishlist for Democrats. This bill expands state authority in areas like energy, public utility regulation, and implementing or subsidizing climate change lunacy. During the debate of this bill, Speaker Melissa Hortman illegitimately refused to allow Republicans to make points of order, inquiries, or other motions while ramrodding the bill through to meet the legislative deadline. Massive protest from Republicans can be heard on the House floor during this bill's “discussion” and “vote”. Many GOP House Representatives chose to not vote on this piece of legislation in protest of the corruption underway. A vote against this legislation or an abstained vote will be rated positively in the House because either represent the liberty position due to the circumstances of the vote. Since the Senate had not yet descended into full chaos where motions and points cannot be raised, the only proper vote during the Senate debate was a no vote. Abstained votes rejected the legitimacy of the entire process and no votes illustrates opposition to this crooked piece of legislation. Because either position carries a strong rationale, both will be rated positively. Since the votes are scored the same and “No” votes are not listed separately, the 11 House Republicans who voted against the bill are: Bennett, Demuth, Dotseth, Hudson, Mueller, Nadeau, Nash, Novotny, Rarick, Robbins, and Urdahl. All others in the House rated positively in the House abstained. Absences will be rated a 0.5/1.

HF5247 - Omnibus Tax Bill

House Vote: 70-50 (5/19/24)

Senate Vote: 34-14 (5/19/24)

CORRECT VOTE: NO/ABSTAIN

This bill is a 218 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that spends hundreds of millions of taxpayer dollars, adds new regulations, and served as a giant wishlist for Democrats. This bill expands state authority in areas like energy, public utility regulation, and implementing or subsidizing climate change lunacy. During the debate of this bill, Speaker Melissa Hortman illegitimately refused to allow Republicans to make points of order, inquiries, or other motions while ramrodding the bill through to meet the legislative deadline. Massive protest from Republicans can be heard on the House floor during this bill's “discussion” and “vote”. Many GOP House Representatives chose to not vote on this piece of legislation in protest of the corruption underway. SF5335 - Human Services Omnibus

House Vote: 69-0 (5/19/24)

Senate Vote: 38-27 (5/19/24)

CORRECT VOTE: NO/ABSTAIN

This bill is a 209 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that spends hundreds of millions of taxpayer dollars, adds new regulations, and served as a giant wishlist for Democrats. This bill is over 200 pages long and expands state authority in areas such as energy, public utility regulation, and implementing or subsidizing climate change lunacy. During the debate of this bill, Speaker Melissa Hortman illegitimately refused to allow Republicans to make points of order, inquiries, or other motions while ramrodding the bill through to meet the legislative deadline. Massive protest from Republicans can be heard on the House floor during this bill's “discussion” and “vote”. Many GOP House Representatives chose to not vote on this piece of legislation in protest of the corruption underway. A vote against this legislation or an abstained vote will be rated positively in the House because either represent the liberty position due to the circumstances of the vote. Since the Senate had not yet descended into full chaos where motions and points cannot be raised, the only proper vote during the Senate debate was a no vote. Abstained votes rejected the legitimacy of the entire process and no votes illustrates opposition to this crooked peice of legislation. Because either position carries a strong rationale, both will be rated positively. Absences will be scored as a 0.5/1.

SF4225 - Cash Capital Inv. Bill

House Vote: 70-0 (5/19/24)

Senate Vote: 35-2 (5/19/24)

CORRECT VOTE: NO/ABSTAIN

This is a spending bill totaling over \$70 Million for pet projects that politicians were not able to fit into the normal bonding bill. This bill combines all kinds of unrelated projects around the state and insert them within a single omnibus bill rather than allowing proper debate on issues one at a time. During the debate of this bill, Speaker Melissa Hortman and Senate President Bobby Joe Champion illegitimately refused to allow Republicans to make points of order, inquiries, or other motions while ramrodding the bill through to meet the legislative deadline. Massive protest from Republicans can be heard on the House and Senate floors during this bill's “discussion” and “vote”. All House Republicans abstained from the bill and most Senate Republicans did as well. The pro-liberty position would be to vote in opposition or to abstain from the vote to offer no validity to the process. Fortunately, due to time running out and the legislative time clock running out and the midnight deadline passing, the legislation was not passed on time and was therefore not signed by Walz and put into effect. Due to scoring abstained votes and no votes equally for this vote, we note now that Senators Draheim and Jasinski were the two no votes in the Senate vote on this bill while all others rated positively abstained. Absences will be scored as a 0.5/1.

SF5289 - Jobs, Economic Dev. Approp.	House Vote: 83-47 (5/18/24)	Senate Vote: 36-25 (5/18/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a massive 116 page unconstitutional omnibus spending bill that spends hundreds of millions of dollars that inserts the government unnecessarily and over-expansively into the free market. This bill includes nearly \$4.5 Million to "Explore Minnesota Film" and picks winners and losers in the economy based on political preference. As an omnibus bill, this bill is unconstitutional, multi-subject, and enables government run crony-capitalism.			
HF5216 - Judiciary, Public Safety Approp.	House Vote: 107-19 (5/18/24)	Senate Vote: 34-33 (5/19/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a massive 288 page unconstitutional omnibus spending bill that addresses multiple subjects in the form of police conduct, task force creations, correctional facilities, police services, search & rescue services, and more. Included in this bill is the creation of an anti-gun task force focused on removing firearms from individuals accused of domestic violence.			
HF5040 - Pension Omnibus Bill	House Vote: 125-0 (5/7/24)	Senate Vote: 59-8 (5/6/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a 150 page unconstitutional omnibus bill related to increasing pensions for various taxpayer funded positions, notably including teachers, firefighters, and other government employees. This includes expanding pension eligibility in some cases to individuals before they've reached retirement age. Each topic should be debated on its own merit as opposed to an expansive and multi-subject omnibus bill.			
HF4518 - Education Spending Increase	House Vote: 125-0 (3/14/24)	Senate Vote: 51-16 (3/21/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This bill increases funding for K-12 education and is adjusted from previously appropriated funding. This bill additionally increases the amount of individuals eligible for transportation to post-secondary and makes further amendments to spend more of your tax dollars.			
SF4399 - Human Services Omnibus Policy Bill	House Vote: 126-0 (5/15/24)	Senate Vote: 60-7 (5/13/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a 95 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that deals with many topics surrounding human services. While many provisions of the bill are neutral or mundane, they are tucked deep in a bill that will serve as a regulatory disaster that increases the size and scope of government on subjects like housing.			
HF4310 - Higher Edu. Compensation Increase	House Vote: 74-56 (4/11/24)	Senate Vote: 36-29 (5/1/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This bill increases and ratifies compensation and benefit plans for MN college/university administrators, MNSure personnel, the Office of Higher Education unclassified employees, managerial staff, and commissioners/medical specialists. This bill expands the size and scope of government and places a larger burden on taxpayers.			
HF4024 - Higher Edu. Policy/Spending Bill	House Vote: 72-57 (5/17/24)	Senate Vote: 41-26 (5/19/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This bill is an unconstitutional omnibus bill that funds woke universities/colleges in our state and adds regulations and further government influence on education. This bill continues the practice of race-based scholarships, increases spending, and requires colleges/universities adopt new regulations including rules preventing an institution from questioning a student on prior criminal convictions, including violent felonies and sexual assaults, until they've been offered admission.			
HF3911 - Env./Natural Resources Spending	House Vote: 70-56 (5/17/24)	Senate Vote: 37-30 (5/17/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a massive 182 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that adds additional spending of tax dollars on various government agencies and policy ends on top of the already appropriated budget for the department. Included in this bill is over \$5.5 Million in spending for the Metropolitan Council with over \$3.5 Million going to their general fund. This bill continues the nonsense climate change agenda with additional regulations and spending.			
HF3868 - Commercial Code/Digital Reg.	House Vote: 120-8 (3/11/24)	Senate Vote: 59-4 (4/29/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a 132 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that adds more regulations on digital industries and conforms Minnesota law to policies around the country. Uniform laws across states is lazy legislating that diminishes States Rights and this bill serves as a tool to expand governmental regulations.			
HF3800 - Housing Co-Op	House Vote: 128-1 (4/24/24)	Senate Vote: 53-12 (4/30/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This bill creates a new chapter of law that allows the formation and establishes the regulations for housing co-ops which allows housing facilities to be turned into co-ops with shared ownership of members if a vote is held and receives 80% of members vote yes. This bill adds to the regulatory disaster on housing, further inserts the government in private housing decisions of Minnesotans, and promotes alternatives to private ownership.			
HF3646 - Dept. of Children, Youth & Families	House Vote: 85-44 (3/7/24)	Senate Vote: 40-25 (3/14/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a 311 page bill that creates the Department of Children, Youth and Families and transfers duties from the Human Services, Education, and Public Safety departments and gives this authority to the newly created department. The expansion of government creates a larger dependency on tax dollars and shifts responsibilities away from agencies that had the capability to fulfill. This structural change to government is a net negative since it will inevitably lead to further wastes of tax dollars and creating more opportunities for corruption.			

HF3631 - Capital Projects Amended	House Vote: 98-32 (4/8/24)	Senate Vote: 57-9 (4/15/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This bill is an unconstitutional, multi-subject conglomeration of adjustments for pet project funding that politicians campaign on. As a multi-subject spending bill addressing topics irrelevant from one another, this bill fails to be fiscally conservative or allow each topic to receive proper debate.			
HF3589 - E-Sign. Use in Judicial Proceedings	House Vote: 123-0 (3/25/24)	Senate Vote: 65-0 (4/11/24)	CORRECT VOTE: YES
This bill expands the use of electronic signatures in judicial proceedings, giving Minnesotans more convenience on judicial matters. Judicial proceedings should be as accessible, transparent, and speedy as possible and this legislation helps move toward that direction.			
SF3567 - Education Policy Omnibus	House Vote: 68-59 (5/15/24)	Senate Vote: 35-31 (5/13/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a 122 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that contains various regulations and policy provisions related to education. Notably, this bill strips power away from public and school libraries on determining which books are not allowed in their facility. On the issue of age-inappropriate, sexually explicit LGBTQ books, libraries are now facing state mandated requirements to allow such books.			
HF3488 - Minors/Internet Video Creation	House Vote: 103-26 (5/1/24)	Senate Vote: 37-30 (5/9/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This bill added regulations surrounding minors being paid for their involvement in internet video creations. The protection of children and preventing children from being taken advantage of monetarily should be a concern, however, the bill appears to interfere with parental rights and could unintentionally restrict wholesome family content. The bill is too vague to be applicable to reality and requires major restructuring.			
HF3436 - Transportation Policy Omnibus	House Vote: 97-30 (5/7/24)	Senate Vote: 67-0 (5/9/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a 110 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that deals with several areas of transportation policy and regulation. Notably, this bill allows foreign passports, whether they be valid or expired, to be allowed to be used as a primary document when titling or registering a vehicle and does not prohibit their use by illegal aliens. This policy expands the ways our state government has provided avenues for illegal immigrants to take advantage of the liberties and privileges enjoyed by our citizens. Unlike for standard drivers licenses, this bill requires citizenship from applicants for enhanced identification cards or enhanced drivers licenses. This bill does do some work to fix the broken system of titling vehicles but like many omnibus policy bills, this is a mashup of unrelated concepts filled with tedious regulations on the minutiae of issues.			
HF3377 - Env. Trust Fund Spending Modified	House Vote: 94-35 (3/7/24)	Senate Vote: 41-25 (4/4/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is a 76 page unconstitutional omnibus bill that spends tax dollars on various environmental studies and projects. While many provisions may not appear to be controversial, various pet projects jammed together in an omnibus bill is not the proper role of government.			
HF3376 - Digital Fishing/Games Licenses	House Vote: 128-2 (4/11/24)	Senate Vote: 64-0 (4/29/24)	CORRECT VOTE: YES
This bill is a short, single subject piece of legislation that allows individuals to use a digital photograph image of their games or fishing licensing and requires that conservation or peace officers accept the digital copy as a proper form of displaying their game/fishing license during a stop. This bill provides more leniency to citizens and prevents them from unnecessary punitive measures.			
HF2609 - Gun Control Bill	House Vote: 71-59 (5/2/24)	Senate Vote: 34-33 (5/9/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This is an unconstitutional gun control bill that bans binary triggers, expands laws on firearm straw purchase bans, and increases penalties on citizens who transfer a firearm to an ineligible individual. This bill served as yet another encroachment on the 2nd Amendment by increasing the scope of government. This bill passed the House on 5/2/24 with some Republican support with the contents described. The bill was later amended to include a portion of law that works against the principles of the castle doctrine and passed the House in a party line vote.			
HF548/SF733 - Firearm Straw Purchase Bill	House Vote: 60-66 (3/14/24)	Senate Vote: 33-34 (3/21/24)	CORRECT VOTE: NO
This bill a pro-gun control piece of legislation that increases penalties for transferring a firearm to an ineligible person from a gross misdemeanor to a felony that can result in imprisonment for up to two years and a fine up to \$10,000. An aggravated offense can bring imprisonment up to seven years and a fine up to \$20,000. This gun control bill was authored exclusively by Republicans in both chambers and infringed on citizens' 2nd Amendment Right to bear arms. Of course, Democrat opposition to this bill was not out of love for our 2nd Amendment but rather for procedure and making sure that they can get their dirty hands in there to craft gun control as expansively as they would like. The votes in the House were not taken on the bill itself, but rather if the bill should be withdrawn from committee and brought to the floor, which we oppose because we do not support moving any gun control forward legislatively.
