BUILDING ECE POWER: PROFESSIONAL PAY & DECENT WORK CAMPAIGN

Our Professional Pay and Decent Work campaign continues to gain momentum. The AECEO partnered with the Atkinson Centre for Society and Child Development, the Ontario Coalition for Better Child Care, and hosted the Building Skills for Change leadership training through the Institute for Change Leaders facilitated by Olivia Chow (Ryerson University).

By honing the strength and skills of RECEs across the province through leadership training, local Communities of Practice teams have grown to become true leaders in the movement for Professional Pay and Decent Work.

Our provincial teams have raised public awareness by planning local events, sharing ECE stories, and establishing the connection between professional recognition and high quality, universally accessible early years education and care.

Despite public policy uncertainty, we are proud of our teams' dedication and would like to express our gratitude for their hard work.

BUILDING ECE POWER: HUMANS OF ECE CAMPAIGN

In October of 2018, the AECEO launched the Humans of ECE campaign, inspired by the Humans of Basic Income campaign and the iconic Humans of New York social media movement. The goal was to highlight the value of ECE professionals while also raising awareness of professional pay and decent work.

PROVINCIAL WAGE ENHANCEMENT GRANT (WEG) UPDATE

- December 2018: the AECEO heard from RECEs and employers across Ontario regarding their concerns that the WEG would not continue past March 31st, 2019
- January 2019: the AECEO and the OCBCC partnered to collect hardcopy and online petition signatures to continue the WEG for another year
 - -the petition garnered 12,000 signatures in less than 30 days; grand total of over 14,000 signatures
 - -the petition was presented in the Ontario Legislature 16 times
- January 2019: the AECEO advocated for the WEG in their Pre-Budget Submission to the Standing Committee on Finance and Economic Affairs
- February & March 2019: AECEO Community of Practice teams used AECEO tool kit resources to write emails
 and letters, make telephone calls, and meet with their local MPPs to advocate for the WEG
- April 2019: the Provincial Budget announcement did not include information regarding the WEG
 -one week later (April 18th), the Province confirmed that the WEG would continue until March 31st, 2020

Although we were pleased with the continuance of the WEG, it is only a first step in the establishment of a provincial wage scale starting at \$25/hour for new graduates, with increases commensurate with experience and education. The AECEO will continue to advocate for a province-wide wage scale as outlined in Transforming Work in Ontario's Early Years & Child Care Sector: Workforce Strategy Recommendations Presented to the Ministry of Education November 30, 2017 (prepared and published by the AECEO).






