Alliance San Diego welcomes you to the 36th celebration and commemoration of one of the world's greatest visionaries, activists, and leaders, Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Dr. King would have turned 95 years old today and his legacy lives on in all of us. He believed that all people are created equal and all are part of the human family. This fundamental belief is a core principle of Alliance San Diego. It guides our work to create an inclusive democracy so that all people are a part of shaping our future, and all people can live in an environment of harmony, safety, equality, and justice. It also inspires the All Peoples Celebration, recognizing the human dignity in all of us.

See it in yourself and everyone around you, in friends and foes alike. Then together, let's build the 'Beloved Community' envisioned by Dr. King by creating space for respectful dialogue, fostering compassionate policies, and centering human dignity. We do not have to agree on everything to treat each other with humanity, but we do have to be intentional about how we engage one another. That is how we claim our dignity.

We hope you enjoy the program today, which includes keynote speaker Dr. Alisa Warren, the President of the International Association of Official Human Rights Agencies (IAOHRA), as well as local artists and voices who will inspire us to move forward in the spirit of Dr. King. 
## **KEYNOTE SPEAKER**



Dr. Alisa Warren serves as President of the International Association of Official Human Rights Agencies (IAOHRA), a professional association of state and local human rights government agencies serving nearly 250 million people. She is the Executive Director of the Missouri Commission on Human Rights, a state agency working to prevent and eliminate discrimination in employment, housing, and public accommodations.

Dr. Warren engages in extensive education and outreach efforts at the domestic and international levels. She works to leverage strong partnerships which are key to advancing human rights. She is a subject matter expert in human rights appearing on television, radio, and as a keynote speaker. She is a perennial university guest lecturer and conducts training for government agencies, organizations, communities, and businesses. She is a vocal champion for international human rights treaty obligations and advocated before the United Nations Human Rights Committee in Geneva, Switzerland in 2023.

Dr. Warren serves on the Board of Directors for FOCUS St. Louis and the Diversity Awareness Partnership; she is appointed to the Missouri Supreme Court Commission on Race and Ethnic Fairness in the Courts, and the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission Joint Standing Committee. She received the "Most Influential Business Women" Award and the "Women Who Dare to Dream" Distinguished Humanitarian Award. Dr. Warren earned a Ph.D. in Community Development and Social Disparities from the University of Missouri.

# LEO CARRILLO CHANGE AGENT AWARD



Leo Carrillo was an extraordinary change agent. As Alliance San Diego's first full-time organizer, he led with compassion and conviction to empower the community to build an inclusive democracy.

An alumnus of CSU San Marcos, Carrillo had fire in his belly and was eager to help us build Alliance San Diego, which back then did not even have four walls. He helped develop the nascent San Diego Immigrant Rights Consortium (SDIRC), bridging organizations and catalyzing solidarity in the immigrant rights movement. Carrillo also supported our Education Consortium, ASD'S first coalition in the area of education, and drove our first successful policy campaign to extend the college readiness curriculum known as 'A-G' to all students at San Diego Unified. As a result, thousands of students enjoyed and continue to enjoy an unprecedented opportunity. This was a game changer and inspired him to pursue a Master's degree in education at Stanford and a counseling degree at San Diego State University.

As a transformational activist, Carrillo drew courage from his immigrant family and found joy in his LGBTQ family. He was a deeply committed and empathetic person who guided many through the complexities of this world. He gave generously of his talents, insights, and expertise. Long after he worked at Alliance, he came back to shepherd community conversations to talk about fears, anxieties, and hope in moments of political turbulence. He inspired people to find their strength and recognize that they were not alone.

In honor of his memory, Alliance San Diego has created the Leo Carrillo Change Agent Award to recognize a young activist and emerging leader who is working concretely to bring about social change in Leo's spirit and example.

# CARRILLO AWARD HONOREE MITCHELLE WOODSON



Mitchelle Woodson is presented with the inaugural Leo Carrillo Change Agent Award for her outstanding advocacy and her fight for housing as a human right.

Woodson is the executive director and managing attorney of Think Dignity, a nonprofit organization whose mission is to advance basic dignity for people experiencing homelessness. She started at Think Dignity in 2017 as a staff attorney and worked to provide clients with the advocacy and resources they need to support their growth. She now oversees the organization's operations, including the Homeless Youth Legal and Advocacy Project, the Legal and Referral Advocacy Clinics, and the Know Your Rights campaign that aims to empower individuals with knowledge of their legal rights.

Woodson's passion for advocating for San Diego's homeless community has led to the growth and notoriety of Think Dignity as the premier organization for legal representation and advocacy. Her expertise and knowledge is highly sought after, and she has presented at such events as the Yale Law School's Rebellious Lawyering Conference and the Coalition for Juvenile Justice on the issues of homelessness and poverty law.

Woodson is a founding member of FREE-SD, which utilizes the approach of participatory defense, a community organizing model that aims to empower people facing charges and their families to transform the landscape of power in the courtroom; and the DeDe McClure Community Bail Fund, a grassroots organization committed to educating and empowering community members to fight against the devastating effects of the cash bail system and supporting those who have been victimized by it.

# THE ASHLEY L. WALKER SOCIAL JUSTICE AWARD



Ashley L. Walker is a lifelong social justice activist that has left an indelible mark on San Diego. In 2009, the City of San Diego's Human Relations Commission created the Ashley Walker Social Justice Award. In 2019, the commission passed the award to Alliance San Diego. The award recognizes an individual or group for their work in promoting peace, social justice, and human and civil rights in our community.

As a founding board member of Alliance San Diego, Ashley Walker helped create an organization dedicated to building the Beloved Community envisioned by Dr. King. Throughout her life, Ms. Walker has been a freedom fighter for the downtrodden. She is credited with institutionalizing comprehensive and compassionate domestic violence services in the county, creating a model for other cities across the nation through the Family Justice Center, among others.

She also shaped the City of San Diego's Human Relations Commission as its executive director for over 15 years, where she devoted countless hours to creating a more inclusive San Diego. Ms. Walker once described her purpose as follows:

"I try to live a nonviolent life that returns love for hate, defends the absent, includes the excluded, forgives without apology, gives without recognition, that accepts defeat without losing heart, and admits when I am wrong. I work each day to help create the 'beloved community' where those loved and hated, those feared and respected, those disdained and elevated are all present and cared for."

# WALKER AWARD HONOREE TONI G. ATKINS



Senate President pro Tempore Toni G. Atkins is presented with the Ashley Walker Award for her extraordinary public service and unrelenting commitment to build the Beloved Community envisioned by Dr. King.

Atkins was born and raised in rural southwestern Virginia, the daughter of a miner and a seamstress. Her foray into public service began when Atkins served as an aide to San Diego City Councilmember and LGBT trailblazer Christine Kehoe. In 2000, she was elected to replace Kehoe as the council's District 3 representative. Atkins proceeded to hold many other roles including state Assembly and Speaker of the Assembly.

In 2016, Atkins was elected to represent the 39th District in the state Senate. After just one year, she was selected by her colleagues to serve as Senate President pro Tempore. In March 2018, she was sworn in, becoming the first woman and the first openly LGBTQ person to lead the Legislature's upper house.

Throughout her career, Atkins has been a champion for our diverse communities, especially in expanding access to affordable housing. In 2022, she introduced the 'California Dream for All Program,' an innovative new way for the state to help first-time homebuyers dramatically lower or eliminate their down-payment requirements and lower monthly mortgage payments. That same year, she also authored a constitutional amendment to make explicit the fundamental right to abortion and contraceptives. She leads on a range of issues as she works towards a vision of California where everyone belongs and everyone thrives.

#### Miki Vale

Miki Vale is an international Hip Hop performing artist and U.S. Cultural Ambassador of Hip Hop, Teaching Artist, Old Globe-commissioned playwright and founder of SoulKiss Theater, an arts education organization centering and celebrating the voices of Black queer womxn. Her work serves to amplify community consciousness around relationships, wellness, and justice. Vale has performed and participated in panels at landmark venues and festivals in the US and internationally, from Hollywood and D.C. to Mumbai and Cairo. For her contributions to Hip Hop culture, Vale has earned a San Diego Hip Hop Honors Award, a Female Perspective Award, and the 2021 San Diego Music Award for Song of the Year for "Bad Wolves", a song condemning anti-Black racism. For her work within the LGBTQ community, Vale was awarded the 2017 Bayard Rustin Civil Rights Honor.



## Tasha Cobbs Leonard IG: @tashacobbsleonard

A pastor's daughter born and raised in Georgia, Leonard first emerged to widespread acclaim with her breakout 2013 release, Grace, which garnered a GRAMMY, three Doves, and three Stellar Awards on the strength of its chart-topping, platinum-selling lead single, "Break Every Chain." In the years that followed, Leonard would go on to establish herself as a genuine "gospel sensation" (NPR), racking up more than two billion streams across platforms, landing three more #1 singles and five #1 albums, performing with everyone from Common and Nicki Minaj to Ne-Yo and Ciara, and making national television appearances on Good Morning America, CNN's Fourth of July, BET's Black Girls Rock, CBC's A Day Of Healing, and the Super Bowl Gospel Celebration.
