

MEDICAL CANNABIS LAWS HAVE LIMITED FEDERAL PROTECTIONS

First passed by Congress in 2014 as the Rohrabacher-Farr Amendment, this amendment to the Commerce, Justice, & Science (CJS) Appropriations Bill created a "ceasefire" of federal interference in state medical cannabis laws.



None of the funds made available under this Act to the Department of Justice may be used, with respect to any of the States of Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming, or with respect to the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the United States Virgin Islands, Guam, or Puerto Rico, to prevent any of them from implementing their own laws that authorize the use, distribution, possession, or cultivation of medical marijuana.





Guidance Regarding Marijuana Enforcement SUBJECT:

In October 2009 and June 2011, the Department issued guidance to federal prosecutors concerning marijuana enforcement under the Controlled Substances Act (CSA). This memorandum updates that guidance in light of state ballot initiatives that legalize unde the possession of small amounts of marijuana and provide for the regulation of marijua marijuana in all states.

As the Department noted in its previous guidance, Congress has determined that marijuana is a dangerous drug and that the illegal distribution and sale of marijuana is a crime that provides a significant source of revenue to large-scale criminal enterprises, a Cartels. The Department of Justice is committed to enforcement of the CSA consistent Americans for Safe Access | January 04, 2018 | those determinations. The Department is also committed to using its limited investigative and prosecutorial resources to address the most significant threats in the most effective, consistent, and rational way. In furtherance of those objectives, as several states enacted laws relating to the use of marijuana for medical purposes, the Department in recent years has focused its efforts on certain enforcement priorities that are particularly important to the federal government:

- Preventing the distribution of marijuana to minors;
- · Preventing revenue from the sale of marijuana from going to criminal enterprises, gangs, and cartels;
- · Preventing the diversion of marijuana from states where it is legal under state law in some form to other states;
- · Preventing state-authorized marijuana activity from being used as a cover or pretext for the trafficking of other illegal drugs or other illegal activity;



The next Administration will therefore need to: Revitalize the DOJ's use of the array of statutory tools that exist for dealing with the threat of criminal organizations. The most potent ones are the simplest. For example, the department should:

1. Rigorously prosecute as much interstate drug activity as possible, including simple possession of distributable quantities. Recent efforts to create the impression that drug possession crimes are not serious offenses has contributed to the explosion of criminal organization activities in the United States.



2. Aggressively deploy the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act (RICO), which Congress expressly created to empower the Department of Justice to treat patterns of intrastate level crimes, such as robbery, extortion, and murder, as federal criminal conduct for criminal organizations and networks. The next Administration can use existing tools while it works with Congress to develop new tools. p.554-555

Dear Misters Crandall, Martin, and Tsang,

As United States Attorney for the District of Columbia, I receive requests for information and charification. I take these requests seriously and act on them with letters life this one you are receiving.

I am writing to each of you about the marijuana dispensity operating under the business name Green Theory hocated at 4828 MacArthur Blvd here in Washington, DC. It is my understanding that each of you is either an owner or operator of this dispensary. This dispensary appears to be operating within 1,000 feet of several schools, including: Our Lady of Victory Catholic School; the River School; St. Patrick's Episcopal Day School; the Lab School; and Little livies preschool.

As you likely know, there are numerous federal laws governing and even prohibiting the distribution and possession of marijuana, including provisions of the Controlled Substances Act. Your dispensary appears to be operating in violation of federal law, and the Department of Justice has the authority to enforce federal law even when such activities may be permitted under sales of local law. Persons and entities owning, operating, or facilitating such dispersaries (as well as premises grow centers) may be subject to criminal prosecution and civil enforcement actions under federal law. Moreover, enhanced federal penalties may apply when a dispensary is operating within 1,000 feet of a school, See 21 U.S.C. § 880(a).



- (1) twice the maximum punishment
