


Topline Results



Daily smoking consists of participants who report smoking at least once a day. Regular smoking consists of participants who report smoking daily, weekly, or monthly.


Daily & regular smoking continues to fall; never smoking continues to rise




Māori and Pacific smoking remains disproportionately high

Daily smoking rates for Māori and Pacific participants were significantly higher than for non-Māori non-Pacific participants.

Daily smoking rates for Māori participants were over higher than for non-Māori non-Pacific, with Māori girls reporting the highest daily smoking rates.



Daily smoking decrease continues to slow in 2017



Daily smoking rates for both Māori and non-Māori non-Pacific continue to decrease. they However, may have slowed and may approaching be threshold threshold 5x higher for Māori.
