Where's My Project?



In 2022, Atlanta voters approved funding for safety projects, including sidewalks, safer crossings, and protected infrastructure, through Moving Atlanta Forward to make everyday travel safer.

Today, only 27% of those projects have reached the street. While safety projects stall, the City is rapidly delivering \$120 million in resurfacing projects approved in 2024 ahead of the 2026 World Cup. This shows that what gets built reflects who and what the City prioritizes.

Peachtree Street: A Known Safety Issue Without a Permanent Solution



The shared street pilot was removed, leaving behind a faded crosswalk.



After people were killed, the street was repaved without any visible crossing.



Atlanta City Council has passed resolutions to reinstall a crossing, but the administration has not moved the project forward.



Permanent safety improvements were never delivered forward.



What was promised?

These projects were approved and funded by voters, who expected them to be delivered.

- Peachtree St Safe Street – Downtown
- Courtland St & Piedmont Ave Safe Streets



Where is it now?

Most of these projects remain in the planning or design process. This reflects a broader citywide pattern where important safety projects are not constructed.

These project delays needlessly expose residents to further harm, continuing a citywide problem of hostility to pedestrians.

Residents shouldn't have to wait years for projects they paid for, especially in the light of recent deaths along this corridor.

What is missing?



Continuous sidewalks, ending large gaps that force people into streets



Accessible curb ramps are being installed, but not paired with full intersection safety upgrades



Safe, visible crossings at high-injury locations



Protected safety infrastructure on key corridors



Streets are being resurfaced without the full safety upgrades voters approved

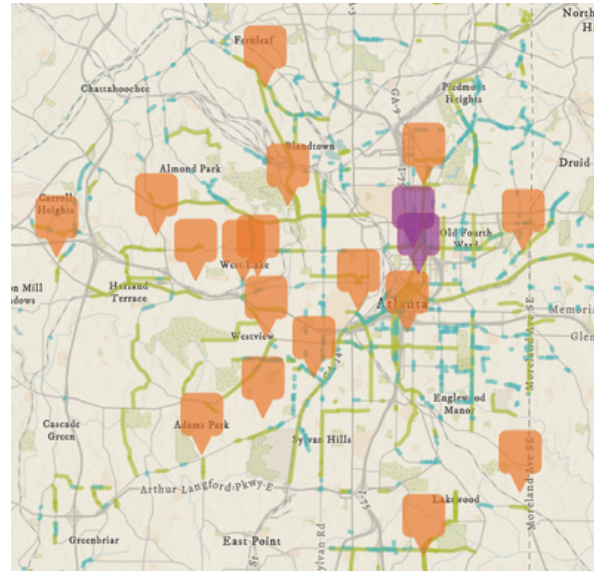


Why does this matter?

You deserve to move through your neighborhood safely and with dignity.

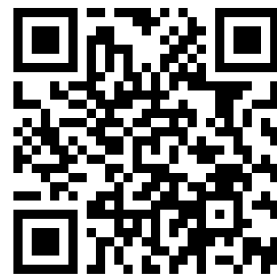
