## Where's My Project?



In 2022, Atlanta voters approved funding for safety projects, including sidewalks, safer crossings, and protected infrastructure, through Moving Atlanta Forward to make everyday travel safer.

Today, only 13% of those projects have reached the street. While safety projects stall, the City is rapidly delivering \$120 million in resurfacing projects approved in 2024 ahead of the 2026 World Cup. This shows that what gets built reflects who and what the City prioritizes.

### Core infrastructure is still not in place across Atlanta.

## What was promised?

These simple improvements are voter approved and funded, but they have yet to be delivered:

- Bus shelters & rider experience Improvements
- Sidewalk repair on major streets



## Where is it now?

Across the city, safety projects are not being constructed: Bus shelters are still in planning; sidewalks are being constructed but progress has been inconsistent.

These project delays needlessly expose residents to further harm, continuing a citywide problem of hostility to pedestrians.

We shouldn't have to wait years for basic safety, especially when it's already been promised.

## What is missing?



Continuous sidewalks, ending large gaps that force people into streets



Accessible curb ramps are being installed, but not paired with full intersection safety upgrades



Safe, visible crossings at high-injury locations



Protected safety infrastructure on key corridors



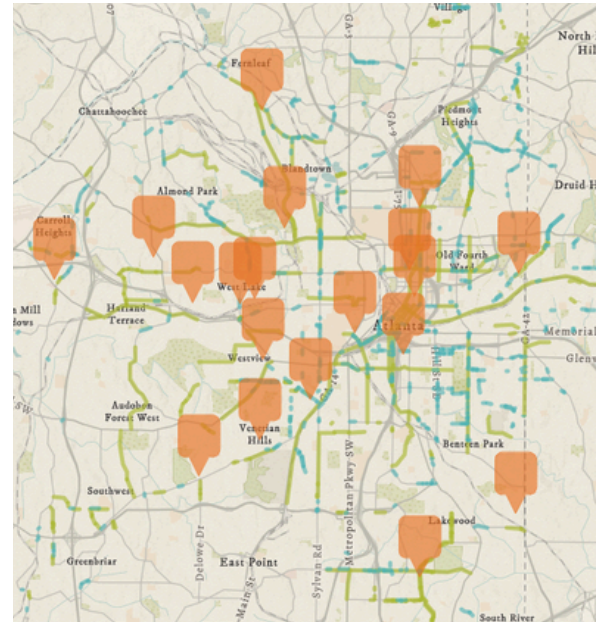
Streets are being resurfaced without the full safety upgrades voters approved

Every day, people cross unsafe streets to reach transit, work, school, and groceries. Without sidewalks, safe crossings, and safe, accessible design for people with disabilities, routine trips become dangerous.

Delaying these projects leaves people exposed to easily avoidable harm. Safe streets are essential infrastructure for a walkable, livable city.

## The Clear Ask

We call on the City of Atlanta to:

- 1 Advance stalled projects into construction within 12 months
- 2 Deliver resurfacing with sidewalks, ADA, and safety upgrades
- 3 Publish clear, public timelines for every project
