- What current technological, social-economic, or demographic trends do you see that directly impact PSE in BC? Which do you believe are key trends that will impact the PSE in the next 30 years?
- How could the PSE system change respond adequately to these trends?
- What modifications to the funding formula would you recommend considering the above?
