Dear Minister Chalmers, Minister Bowen, Minister Collins, and Senator McAllister,

Re: Expansion of the Household Energy Upgrades Fund

We represent 74 civil society organisations with interests in energy affordability, health, climate justice, workers' rights, and housing. We are writing to commend you on the progress of the initial Household Energy Upgrades Fund announced in the 2023-2024 Federal budget and to urge you to increase the funding to ensure all social housing is upgraded.

This initiative, which included a dedicated \$300 million to partner with states and territories to improve the energy performance of social housing, is a step forward in addressing the cost of living crisis. It will also improve housing conditions for some of the most disadvantaged people in our society living in some of the lowest-quality housing.

We are pleased to see multiple state and territory governments have announced that they will match the funding by delivering programs that will impact tens of thousands of people. The Federal Government's leadership has catalysed a further \$150 million in co-contributions so far, contributing to climate mitigation, improved health and wellbeing outcomes, and heatwave resilience.

However, the initial funding will only reach a fraction of the over 400,000 social housing dwellings in Australia. It's clear that significantly more investment is needed to realise these benefits for all social housing tenants. We are also concerned that there is currently little dedicated funding to retrofit remote First Nations social housing, where needs and benefits are significant.

Given this, we urge you to establish targets and track progress to improve the energy performance (energy efficiency, electrification and, where suitable, rooftop solar with battery storage) to ensure all suitable social housing is retrofitted by 2030. This requires expanding the \$300m social housing component of the Household Energy Upgrades Fund in the 2024-2025 budget, with at least a six-fold increase in total funding out to 2030. We also call for a dedicated stream of federal government funds to prioritise remote social and Aboriginal-controlled housing, which could support the First Nations Clean Energy Strategy.

Expanding this successful program will address cost-of-living pressures for more people in our community, improve health and wellbeing outcomes, build climate resilience, help to develop the industry capacity needed to improve the energy performance of our housing stock more broadly, and contribute to meeting carbon emission reduction goals. Improved energy performance will also help social housing tenants to share in the potential benefits of tariff reform and demand-response measures.

We applaud your leadership in this vital area and look forward to seeing the Household Energy Upgrades Fund grow in scope and impact. We are eager to discuss this further and would welcome the opportunity to meet with you to discuss this initiative and how it can be developed further.
