THE NEED IN MISSISSIPPI

Demand for afterschool programs in Mississippi have surged as parents realize the benefits, including keeping children safe, helping them learn, and providing peace of mind for working families. For every child in an afterschool program, three are waiting for available space. That number is even higher in the Delta.

Parents and guardians overwhelmingly agree **afterschool**, **and summer programs provide critical support**. Our Boys & Girls Clubs programs inspire kids to learn. They support our children's social and emotional well-being with opportunities to learn life skills, including communicating and working in teams.

Parents are overwhelmingly satisfied with the structured experience we provide for children. Our summer and afterschool programs provide a safe, structured environment with access to programs that keep them active, involved with peers, and prevent summer learning loss.

Five Key Elements for Positive Youth Development

- 1. Create a safe, positive environment
- 2. Generate fun and foster a sense of belonging
- 3. Encourage supportive relationships with peers and adults
- 4. Provide opportunities and set expectations
- 5. Offer recognition

These five elements are fundamental to our success. They enable youth to participate meaningfully in their Club experience and help boost positive outcomes.

The five critical elements for positive youth development lay the foundation for implementing effectively targeted programs and high-yield learning activities. These elements help young people build core physical, cognitive, social, and emotional skills when used intentionally and consistently.

The **primary goal** is to provide an outcome-driven Club experience focused on creating fun and enriching programs within safe environments where adults and youth work in partnership. By creating supportive, nurturing relationships that connect children to their local Club, we can ensure they participate and stay engaged throughout high school.

Attendance is voluntary, and experience shows us that kids "vote with their feet" - if they are not having fun, they will not attend the Club regularly. Regular attendance (a minimum of 3 days per week) is critical for Club members to get all the Club's benefits. All of our third-grade members, who attended their Club a minimum of three days per week, tested on par or above their grade level in reading.

Targeted Programs: What are they, and what do they tell us?

Targeted programs are another critical component of the outcome-driven Club experience. They have sequenced learning experiences with specific objectives for building skills and knowledge. They help youth acquire useful knowledge and build new skills. They also help youth avoid, cope with, or overcome risks and challenges prevalent in our society. These challenges include dropping out of school, engaging in violence, and delinquency.

These programs are vital in measuring and evaluating our efficacy and how participants achieve goals and objectives. These measurements allow us to constantly assess how well we are doing and, more importantly, how well our youth are progressing.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT & ENRICHMENT

BGC MS Delta equips members with the skills, training and education they need to pursue their goals and interests. Whether through tutoring and homework help, access to technology, college and career readiness programs, or skills development, Boys & Girls Clubs of the Mississippi Delta have an outstanding track record of helping young people make academic advancements.

2019-2020 BGC MS Delta Results*

- 92% of Club members are on track to graduate from high school
- 82% of teens average a B grade or better in school.





2 | CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT

BGC MS Delta members build character while beingtaughtto be productive, caring, responsible citizens through our high quality programs and a supportive staff who model good behavior. In addition to fostering accountability, we also help young people develop leadership skills, a sense of civic duty, and an understanding of the value of giving back to their communities.

2019-2020 BGC MS Delta Results*

- 80% of youth have avoided getting into fights
- 75% of youth feel they have good leadership skills

HEALTHY LIFESTYLES

BGC MS Delta teaches members to make and model healthy physical, social, and emotional choices. We do this by providing safe spaces for members to practice healthy decision making, participate in physical activities, and engage in programming designed to promote social and emotional well-being.

2019-2020 BGC MS Delta Results*

- 50% of youth are physically active for five or more days per week
- 100% of youth abstain from drinking, smoking cigarettes, and using marijuana
- Zero teen pregancies among Club members



POST-PANDEMIC PRIORITIES

This five-part plan includes researching stakeholders' top priorities, trends in youth development, and professional development training. It will guide us to meet the changing needs of our youth. This plan creates a timely and flexible framework by which we will present time-tested BGCA programming, supplemented with additional programs designed to meet these changes.

We plan to increase STEM programs, trauma-informed care, learning loss experienced during the pandemic, and organic inclusion for diversity. This five-part plan fully supports BGCA's three priority outcomes: healthy lifestyles, academic success, and good character and citizenship.

STRATEGIC GOALS

Part I: Workforce Development

Programs introduce youth to local business and industry leaders. We focus on identifying career interests and helping youth refine their interview skills.

Parents have access to the Clubs' computer labs for job searches. We offer assistance in resume building, improving computer skills, and various entrepreneurial skills.

Part II: CPR and Trauma

Clubs hold CPR training and certification for youth and adults twice per year. Training is open to the community.

A counselor or licensed social worker is on staff and visits each Club. The counselor addresses traumatic experiences, teaches healthy coping skills, and provides counseling through individual and group discussions.

Part III: Social and Emotional Learning

We develop foundations for success in school and life by building life skills. We teach kids to achieve their goals through perseverance. Youth learn to make responsible and healthy decisions and reduce harmful and risky behaviors. They develop a sense of self-worth and, in turn, show compassion and empathy for others.

Part IV: Community Service

Youth-led projects promote a sense of civic responsibility while positively addressing community needs. Youth gain exposure to those running the local and state government while building excitement about civic involvement.

Part V: Writing and Communication

We provide programs that promote literacy and develop critical thinking skills. Youth learn to exchange ideas and expand their awareness of global issues. They can build their own voice through storytelling while generating excitement about reading and writing.

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, & MATH (STEM) PROGRAMS



ELECTRONIC MUSIC INVENTOR KITS

STEM activities that focus on music, including how to build a guitar



SPACE ROVER INVENTOR KITS

STEM activities that teach youth, aged 8-18, to design space rovers

DIY STEM

A curriculum that connects youth ages 9-12 to science themes they encounter regularly. It includes five modules:

- Energy and Electricity
- Engineering Design
- Food Chemistry
- Aeronautics
- Science of Sports: Football





SNAP CIRCUITS JUNIOR AND LIGHTS KITS

A STEM kit with activities that connect youths aged 8-18 to electronics.

These kits include more than 100 projects for members to engage their minds and interest in engineering.

3D PRINTERS

A growing fundamental technology, the 3D printer has lesson plans for all ages designed to ignite STEM education in the 21st Century information age.

Students can build learning skills and absorb more through hands-on activities, resulting in the development of new knowledge. Each Club has its own 3D Dremel printer.



CLUB SITE FEATURES

For the past three years, the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Mississippi Delta have committed to closing the opportunity gap in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) with creative programs, activities, and resources. Afterschool and summer learning environments provide opportunities to advance STEM knowledge and increase interest in careers in math and science.

STEM curriculum connects youth to science themes they encounter regularly. Special attention is paid to connections of theory and application, and the everyday interactions that members have with these scientific principles. We have implemented the DIY (Do It Yourself) hands-on STEM curriculum provided by Boys & Girls Clubs of America through partnerships with leading companies and foundations.

- STEM Labs: Fully functioning STEM exploration stations and activities for all members.
- Creativity Centers: Visual, musical, dramatic, and literary arts areas.
- Computer Labs: Wifi-enabled computers and printers for members and their families.
- Club Kitchens: Culinary learning, meal and snack prep, and dining areas.

- Teen Centers: Offer teens an area for games, programming, discussions, and project planning.
- Community Areas: Communal spaces within each Club are available for a variety of activities.
- Gymnasiums: Dedicated indoor recreational space allows for organized physical activities.
- Outdoor Areas: Outdoor space for organized activities of all types.
