I remember how it felt to be ignored, to be told in actions if not in words that my voice didn't matter. I decided then and there that I would channel my anger, my concern, my care into action.*

  - *District 6 deserves so much better than what it's been getting.*

- *I believe the PRZ needs an overhaul. It doesn't make sense to draw the lines the way they currently do, "as the crow flies." If we insist on making the PRZ based on a distance of 1 mile, I believe that needs to be 1 mile of walking on public streets, not cutting through fields, private property, or crossing creeks or train tracks. There are major issues with PRZs and the impact it has on students and families. I look forward to working with other members of the school board to make amendments to the current policy.*

  - *Walking and biking contribute to students' overall well-being in many ways! Walking and biking are great for cardiovascular health, and being outside in nature is great for mental well-being! Getting outside early in the day can help with Vitamin D absorption, and having good levels of Vitamin D in the body helps with mood stabilization. Walking and biking also help establish these healthy, active habits from an early age, increasing the likelihood that these habits will continue into adulthood.*
