New Recycling Options

Pop-up recycling stations

1. plastic bags and film (both smooth and crinkly), plastic foam
2. styrofoam (packaging for electronics and clean meat trays).
3. batteries and light bulbs
4. electronics, phones, computers, vaping devices, smoke detectors, thermostats, ink & toner cartridges
5. small appliances, pens, books, razors and blades
6. egg cartons - both paper and styrofoam

Suggestions for more curbside recycling by the City

- Plastic bags, film, and foam curbside, even if only once a month.
- Single use containers in municipal blue bins on sidewalks in commercial areas, especially areas such as Little Italy where there is a high density of coffee shops.
- Residents should be able to sort and bag each of the other items the recycle depots accept and put them into their blue bins.

Traditional Options for Recycling

Single family homes, duplexes, and triplexes - Curbside service is provided each week or two

- Yellow Bag - paper, cardboard, newspaper, cereal boxes
- Blue Box - most metal and hard plastic containers. **New: Single use coffee cups and lids.**
- Green Bin - kitchen scraps, garden waste, and yard trimmings
- Grey Box - glass bottles (metal or plastic tops go in Blue Box)
- Black Bin - landfill - see pop-up recycling option, above

Apartments, condos, and townhomes

The same items as for single family homes are generally deposited into larger bins. If your neighbours need help to sort, we can present a Recycling 101 seminar.

Other items to recycle
