New Recycling Options

Pop-up recycling stations

1. plastic bags and film (smooth and crinkly), plastic foam
2. styrofoam (packaging for electronics and clean meat trays).
3. batteries and light bulbs
4. electronics, phones, computers, small appliances, vaping devices, pens, smoke detectors, thermostats, ink & toner cartridges

- **Trout Lake Farmers Market** - Saturday, 1 - 2 pm / West entrance at Lakewood and 13th
- **Kitsilano Farmers Market** - Sunday, 10:30 - 11:30 am / Kits Community Centre, 10th at Larch
- **Mt Pleasant Farmers Market** - Sunday, 1 - 2 pm / North entrance at 7th

Traditional Options for Recycling

Single family homes and duplexes - Curbside service is provided each week or two

- Yellow Bag - paper, cardboard, newspaper, cereal boxes
- Blue Box - most metal and hard plastic containers. **New: Single use coffee cups and lids.**
- Green Bin - kitchen scraps, garden waste, and yard trimmings
- Grey Box - glass bottles (metal or plastic tops go in Blue Box)
- Black Bin - landfill - see pop-up recycling option, above

Apartments, condos, and townhomes

The same items as for single family homes are generally deposited into larger bins. Read your signs carefully to be sure your items are recycled correctly.

Other items to recycle

Recycle depots accept large appliances, paint, large power tools, outdoor equipment, exercise equipment, etc. For details, visit www.vancouver.ca and click on the Waste Wizard.
