# Methodology

## Sample

- Conducted nationally amongst 1228 people aged 18+, including 868 living in NSW, ACT, QLD, SA, NT or WA
- Respondents were drawn from the online consumer panel managed by Lightspeed Research, OmniPoll's online partner.
  - sample quotas were set for each state, city and regional area, by sex and age.

## Interviews

- Conducted online over the period 1-6 December, 2022.

## Weighting

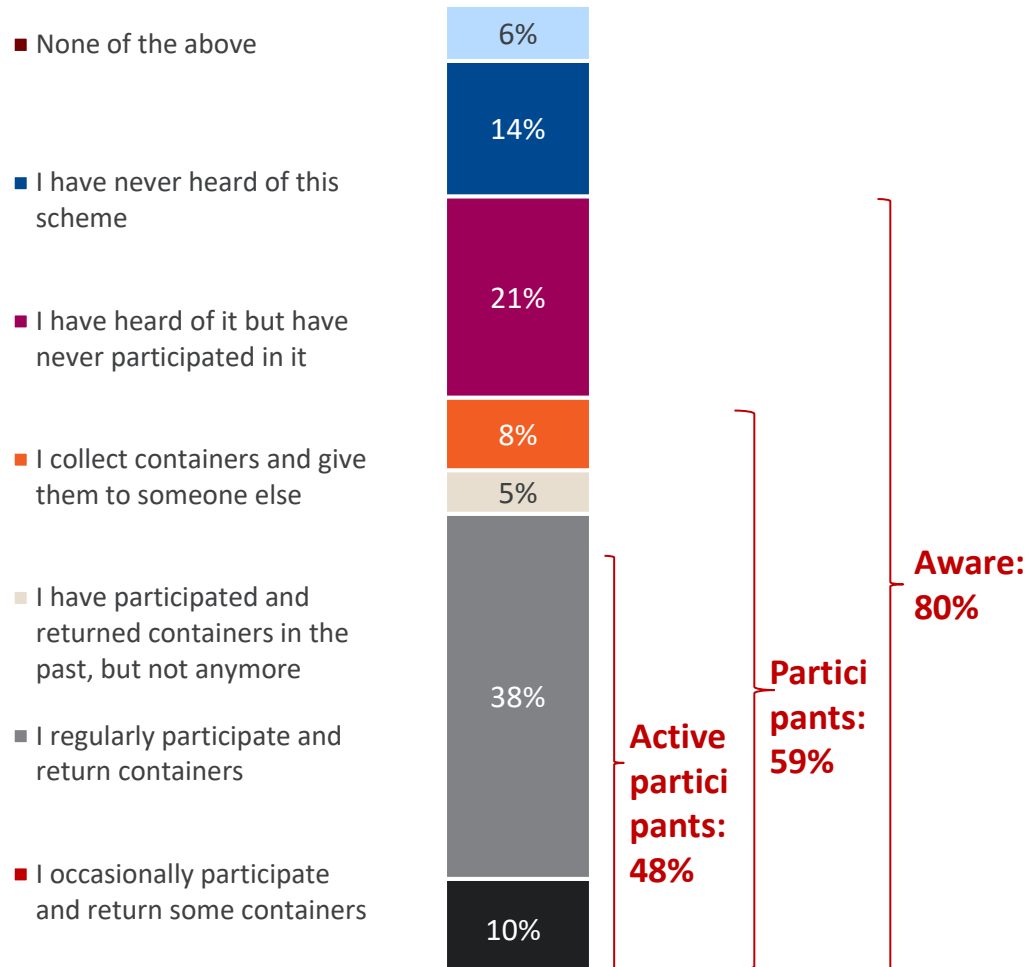
- To help reflect the overall population distribution, results were post-weighted to Australian Bureau of Statistics (**2021 Census**) data on education, age, sex and area.

## Key findings

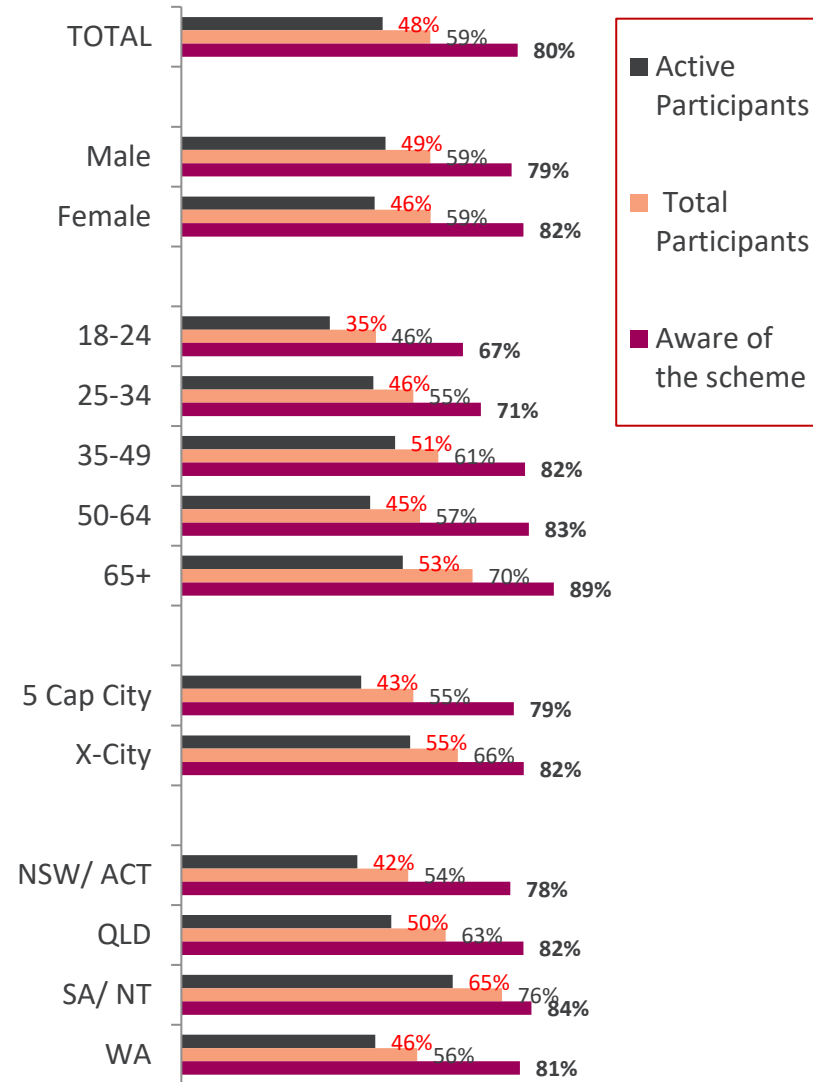
The Container Deposit Scheme (CDS), is a scheme that was first implemented in South Australia in 1977 and over the decades has spread to the Northern Territory in 2012, New South Wales in 2017, the Australian Capital Territory in June 2018, Queensland in November 2018 and Western Australia in October 2020. Schemes in the remaining states of Tasmania and Victoria are due to commence in the near future.

- In SA, NT, NSW, ACT, QLD and WA, **8 in 10 are aware of the scheme, 6 in 10 participate or participated** and 48% are active participants (38% regularly participate and 10% occasionally). Participation and awareness are higher in SA /NT, where the scheme was first launched.
- **Almost all participants (93%) support the expansion of the 10cts refund scheme** for drink bottles and cans to include more containers, like wine and spirit bottles (73% strongly support the idea). Only 2% of adults oppose the expansion of the scheme.

# 8 in 10 are aware of the scheme and 6 in 10 participate or have participated
