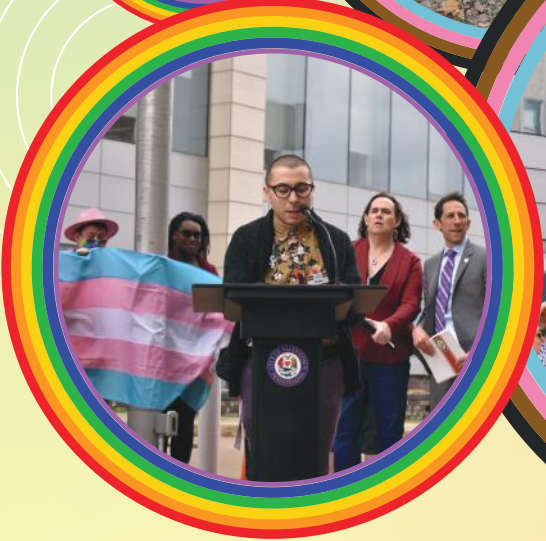

"Last year, at Lititz Pride, a mother walked up to me with tears in her eyes and told me that she could not find a medical provider who could assist her transgender child with HRT (hormone replacement therapy). She was driving over an hour away to a provider and it was not a commute her family could sustain for much longer. I immediately gave her a resource and referral line card and explained that if she contacted us, we would provide her with any HRT providers we had on our internal list that were close to where she lived.

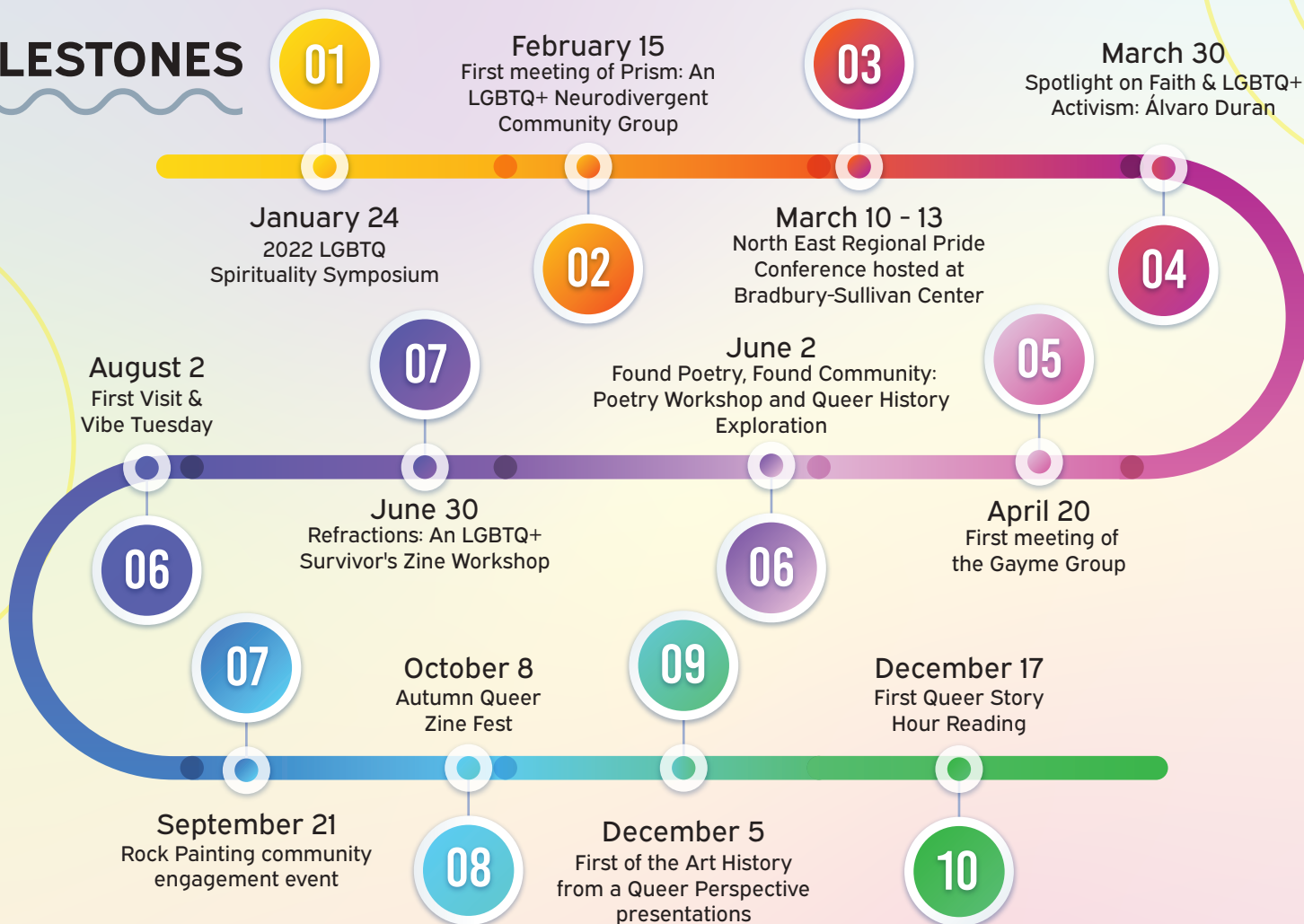
