



About the Summit Host

Climate and Health Alliance

Climate change is the greatest threat to health we face - driving escalating harms to public health and straining healthcare systems. The Climate and Health Alliance (CAHA) is addressing this challenge by building the power of the health movement for climate action, community resilience and sustainable healthcare.

CAHA works with our ^100 members representing 47 health professions toward health in all policies; to promote equitable population health outcomes by influencing policy within and beyond the health sector. CAHA also works toward health sector transformation to accelerate the transition to a decarbonised, sustainable and resilient health system. We coordinate the <u>Global Green and Healthy Hospitals</u> (GGHH) Network in the Pacific region (Australia and New Zealand) supporting health systems, hospitals and healthcare services to act.



Recognition and Commitment

We recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People as the traditional custodians of lands in Australia, Maori in Aotearoa and Pacific Island leaders. Since 2012, CAHA has partnered with leading healthcare stakeholders to run annual forums focused on environmentally sustainable healthcare, and events and advocacy focused on public health throughout the year.

In 2025 we will bring our members, partners and program participants together for The Climate + Health Summit in recognition of the urgency of climate change and the opportunity for collective learning and action. This event will facilitate shared learning to:

- Accelerate knowledge transfer from evidence to policy and action
- Actively involve and meaningfully connect every participant
- Learn from Queensland health organisations in the wake of recent climate impacts
- Showcase practical innovations in public health, health systems and supply chains
- Offer experiences to build personal resilience for health leaders

Target audience

Those interested in improving the environmental footprint of healthcare (including aged care) and fostering a healthy future for people and the planet. The Summit is of particular interest to healthcare sustainability champions (operations, clinical, support, leadership); healthcare executive and management; health environment and sustainability leaders and representatives from government; academics and researchers; students; sustainability innovators and practitioners.

Expected attendance

We expect ~400 people in total to attend the Summit in 2025, with approximately 150-180 people attending in person; and over 200 people watching the recorded content after the event.

Attendee numbers of the 2023 Climate & Health Forum included:

- 240 attendees over both days in person
- 21 group viewings (included ~135 attendees on both days)
- 162 attendees online over both days

A total of 37 expert speakers and 14 workshop facilitators took part in the Forum.
