Yes	The threshold of 40% affordable housing, on a site by site basis, may not be practical in every instance, especially where existing building preservation (with a church or other historic building, for instance) or site remediation are considerable factors. It's especially important to ensure that units are accessible if they're going to be built by the City of Hamilton. The waiting times for accessible affordable housing units are extraordinarily long, putting people in precarious living situations.
