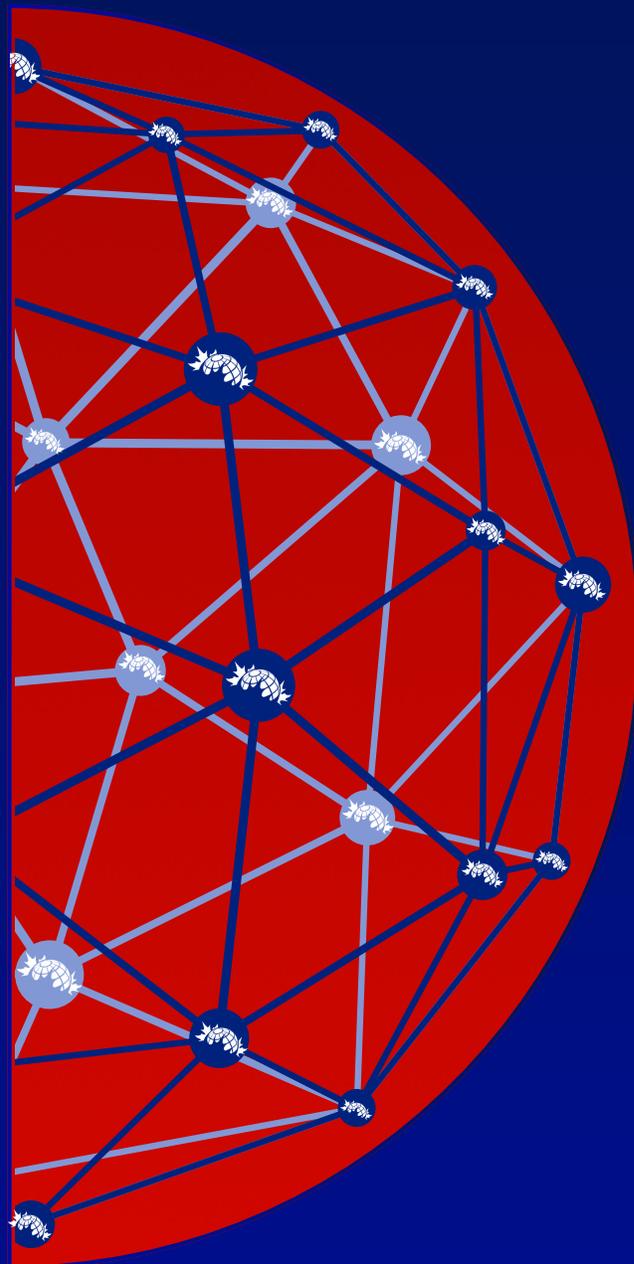
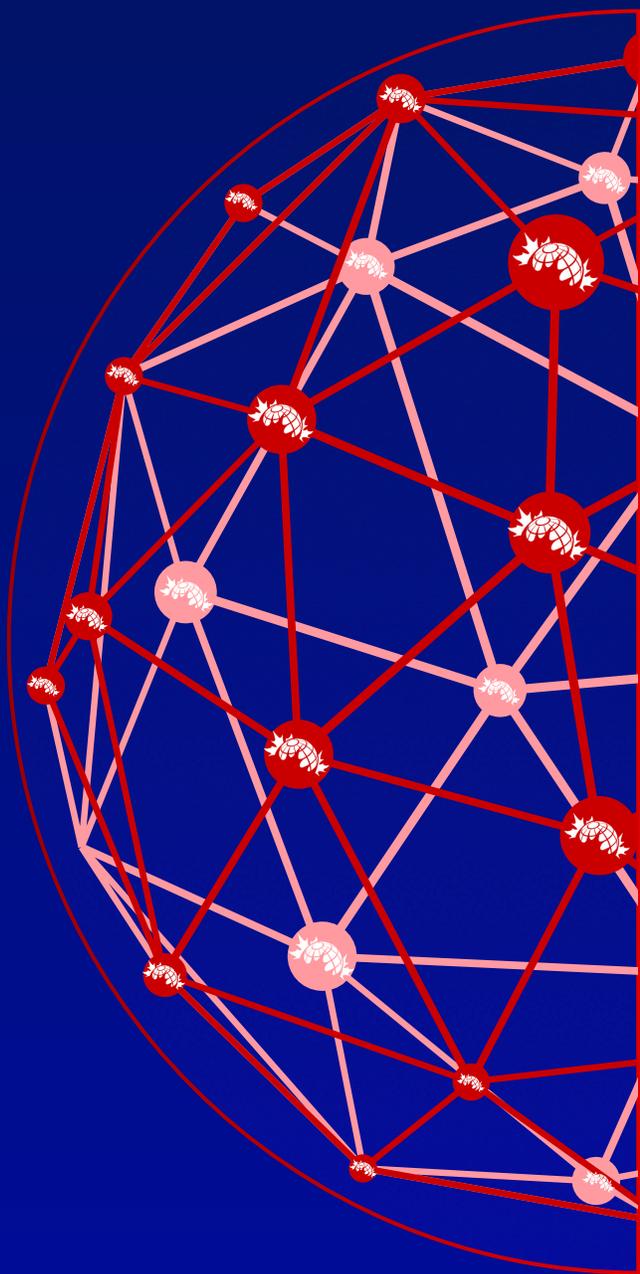

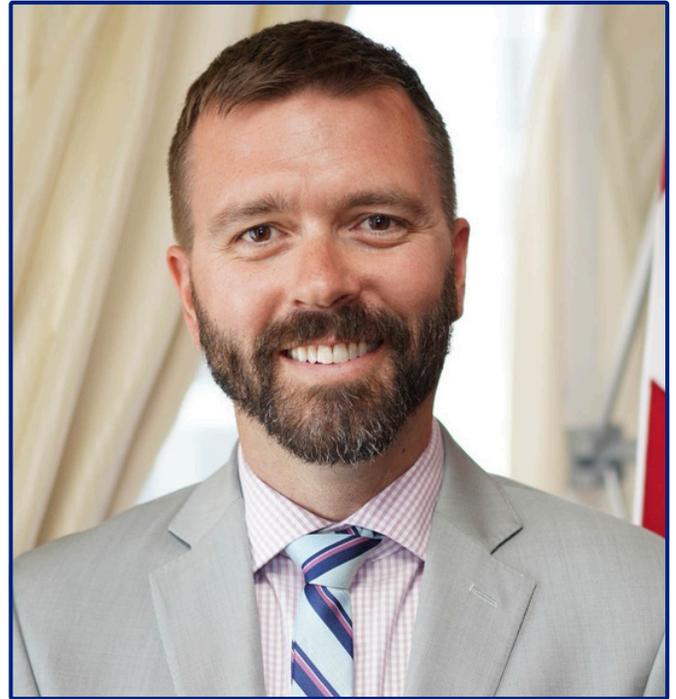
## DR. DAVID PERRY

*President and CEO*

### **Canadian Global Affairs Institute**

Dr. David Perry is the President of the Canadian Global Affairs Institute, host of the institute's Defence Deconstructed Podcast, and a co-director of the Triple Helix MINDs Collaborate Network. He is the author of multiple publications related to defence budgeting, transformation and procurement and a columnist for the Canadian Naval Review.

He received his PhD in political science from Carleton University where his dissertation examined the link between defence budgeting and defence procurement. He is an adjunct professor at the Centre for Military and Strategic Studies at the University of Calgary and a research fellow of the Centre for the Study of Security and Development at Dalhousie University.



He was previously the Senior Security and Defence Analyst of the Conference of Defence Associations Institute and Deputy Director of Dalhousie University's Centre for Foreign Policy Studies. Embassy Magazine and The Hill Times has named him one of the "Top 100 Influencing Canadian Foreign Policy."



## THE HONOURABLE JENNA SUDDS

Jenna has been highly engaged in her community since moving to Kanata in 2001. Jenna spent the first twelve years of her career working as an economist in the Federal Government.

Jenna became the founding President and Executive Director of the newly formed Kanata North Business Association (KNBA) in 2013. After four years of supporting Kanata businesses, Jenna became the Executive Director of the CIO Strategy Council, a national technology council.

From 2010 to 2013, Jenna served in various leadership roles in the Kanata Food Cupboard executive team. In 2016, she took on the role of Chair. Jenna also oversaw the many capital construction and development projects occurring in our community, including the improvement of local roads and development of new residential subdivisions.

In 2020, Jenna took on the additional role of Ottawa Deputy Mayor.



Jenna Suds was sworn in as the Member of Parliament for Kanata—Carleton in the 44th Parliament of Canada on October 25th, 2021. She was appointed to serve as the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Women, Gender Equality, and Youth by Prime Minister Trudeau on December 3rd, 2021. Jenna Suds proudly served as Minister of Families, Children, and Social Development from July 26, 2023 until March 13, 2025. Since June 5, she has served as the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Government Transformation, Public Works and Procurement and to the Secretary of State.



## VADM (RET'D) RON LLOYD

A native of Taber, Alberta, Vice-Admiral (Ret'd) Ron Lloyd was the 35th Commander of the Royal Canadian Navy from 2016-2019. During that time he was also “double hatted” as the acting Vice Chief of the Defence Staff for almost half a year and as the first Chief Data Officer for the Department of National Defence and Canadian Armed Forces for a full year.

During his 38 year career in the RCN, he was privileged to have commanded HMCS CHARLOTTETOWN, HMCS ALGONQUIN, the PACIFIC Fleet and the ATLANTIC fleet. He has extensive operational experience having deployed on numerous occasions globally. Lloyd has over a decade of experience at National Defence



Headquarters having also served as the Deputy Commander of the RCN, the Chief of Force Development for the Canadian Armed Forces, the Director General of Force Development for the RCN and Executive Assistant to the Commander of the RCN.

LGen Steve Boivin joined the Canadian Armed Forces in 1991 and attended the Collège Militaire Royal de St-Jean from 1991 to 1995 before being transferred to the Royal Military College of Canada. Upon graduation in 1996, he was posted to the 3rd Battalion Royal 22nd Regiment (3 R22eR) in Valcartier, Quebec.

From May 1996 to June 2002, he served as a Platoon Commander, Company Second-in-Command and Deputy Operations Officer. During this period of service, LGen Boivin deployed to Haïti, to East-Timor and to Bosnia-Herzegovina.

In 2003, he was transferred to the 1st Battalion Royal 22nd Regiment (1 R22eR) in Valcartier as Company Second-in-Command and Unit Technical Adjutant. In July 2004, LGen Boivin joined Joint Task Force 2 (JTF 2) and served the majority of the next six years with the Unit, including multiple rotations to Afghanistan.

In August 2010, LGen Boivin was posted to Toronto for the Joint Command and Staff Program (JCSP).



He returned to Ottawa and was seconded to the Privy Council Office with the Afghanistan Task Force.

In the summer of 2012, LGen Boivin was assigned to the Chief of Force Development in the Directorate of Capability Integration.

LGen Boivin assumed command of JTF 2 in 2013 and commanded the unit until 2016. He then attended the National Security Program (NSP) in Toronto and was subsequently posted to the Chief of the Defence Staff's Office as the Special Advisor. In May 2018, LGen Boivin became the Deputy-Commander of the Canadian Special Operations Forces Command and officially assumed command in May 2021.
