






President Biden's Approval Has Begun to Rebound After a Steady Slide, But He is Still Under Water



Since March, increasing shares of Democrats view abortion, gun policy and Supreme Court appointments as very important to their vote


% of registered voters saying each is very important to their vote in the 2022 congressional election











On the whole, would you say that you are satisfied or dissatisfied with the position of the United States in the world today?







- Democrats - Independents - Republicans







Question: What upsets you most about Russia's war in Ukraine?







% who say the following would be a ___ problem for the U.S.



Republicans more likely than Democrats to see China-Taiwan tensions as a very serious problem for the U.S.





If China were to invade Taiwan, would you support or oppose the United States:










