The Commonwealth

Fifty-three countries are members of the Commonwealth. Countries span Africa, Asia, the Americas, Europe and the Pacific and are diverse

 they are amongst the world's largest, smallest, richest and poorest countries. The total population of all members is 2.2 billion, about one third of the world total - with 60% of these under the age of 30. Thirty-one members are small states (countries with a population of 1.5 million or less) but all members have an equal say, regardless of size or economic stature, and this ensures even the smallest member countries have a strong voice.
