Growth of CFM — in CANADA!

Sometime ago, Pat Grappolini did a Google search for references to her late parents, Bernard & Mae Daly, who were among CFM pioneers in Canada. Together, they contributed to early program manuals for couples to use as they explored family life within CFM in Canada.



Pat's random search brought her to the CFM website. Immediately, she thought, perhaps there might be a place here for memories from those early days of CFM-Canada.

So here we are with snippets of what Bernard and Mae wrote for one of their program manuals sometime between 1960-64, the height of civil rights movement.

If not me, who?
If not now, when?
If not this, what?

"Three questions which we have to keep in mind and to which we must know the answers, if we are not to deny the goals of CFM and our Christian witness.

As we get involved with the "others" as this book will have us do, we will see why one little eight year old in New York, after having a Negro boy holidaying with him for two weeks, stopped at the second line of the jingle — "Eeny Meeny Miney Moe" and said to his mother, "I can't call Jimmy that — he's my friend."

Have you ever had a Ukrainian Catholic bishop, priest and lay person tell you they have concrete examples of being treated as second rate Catholics?

Were you listening on an extension when a W. Indian here in Ottawa couldn't rent a room because she was colored?

Have you ever thought or said, "She is a negro, but she's so clean"? "They're Protestant, but they're good people"? Are all of the educational problems here in Ottawa the fault of French Canadians? Has your Jewish neighbour tried to join certain Golf or Boating Clubs in this area?

We are ecumenical with our Anglican and Presbyterian friends. How much dialogue is there with our fellow French-speaking Catholics?

This year's book wants us to see things through the other fellow's eyes – to put our body next to his – not just our mind and our spirit. It wants us to feel by the end of the year, that the person belonging to the other race, religion, or color, and the politician at any level is – like Jimmy – our friend."
