# Six Flags, Great Adventure

#### **Art Institute of Chicago**

The Modern Wing's Balcony Café is a serene spot to recharge with a snack or drink.

# **Chicago Riverwalk**

Located on the south bank of the Chicago River and stretches 1.25 miles from Lake Michigan to Lake Street, the Chicago Riverwalk is where you will find cafes, wineries/bars, restaurants, public arts, museums, boat/kayak rentals, Merchandise Mart (showcases the world's largest digital projection) and Wrigley Building.

#### Museum Campus

57-acre museum park located near Lake Michigan and surrounds three (3) of Chicago's most famous museums as well as Soldier Field (football stadium) and Lakeside Center of McCormick Place (trade/convention center).

#### Museum Campus | Shedd Aquarium

The Shedd Aquarium is home to more than 32,000 aquatic animals, some of which you can actually touch and interact with. The stars of the show are the beluga whales and Pacific white-sided dolphins housed in the Abbott Oceanarium and the underwater viewing gallery, where you can watch the torpedo-like dolphins zip through the water.

# Museum Campus / Field Museum

Check out the Mission Moon exhibit, where you can launch a stomp rocket, get a peek inside the Gemini 12 spacecraft and experience America's first steps on the moon through the eyes of NASA astronaut Jim Lovell. Touch an actual moon rock and examine a meteorite that crashed to earth in the Our Solar System exhibit.

#### Frank Lloyd Wright's Robie House: The Modern House Guided Tour

Considered to be Frank Lloyd Wright's most fully realized Prairie Style house, this 1910 structure joined seven other Wright buildings on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 2019. Discover the "cornerstone of modern architecture" on this guided tour of one of the most important buildings of the 20th century.

#### Frank Lloyd Wright Home & Studio

In 1889, Frank Lloyd Wright completed the construction of a two story residence in Oak Park, IL (approximately 10 miles west of Chicago) - designed for his family and where he produced more than a third of his life's work.

# Wright Around Oak Park: The Modern House Guided Tour

The most comprehensive tour of Frank Lloyd Wright in Oak Park, this is a 0.8 mile all-inclusive walking tour limited to 8 persons. Includes: expanded Home and Studio tour, limited access Studio Balcony and expanded historic neighborhood walking tour including ten Wright homes (exterior only).

#### The 606 (Bloomingdale Trail)

The 606, Chicago's answer to New York's High Line, debuted in 2015. The parks and trails on 2.7 miles of repurposed elevated train tracks connect four neighborhoods, bringing green space to places that need it. The popular trail features a chain of street-level parks, scenic look-out points, an observatory, and public art installations. The 606 gets its name from the common numbers in Chicago's west side zip codes.

Hours: The park is open from 6 AM to 11 PM

#### **Museum of Contemporary Art, Streeterville**

This is one of the largest spaces dedicated to contemporary art in the world. Founded in 1967, it moved into this new location – between Water Tower Place and Lake Michigan – designed by German architect Josef Paul Kleihues in 1996. Alongside the collection of 2,500-plus pieces from 1945 is a stellar line-up of performance art and talks about contemporary works.
