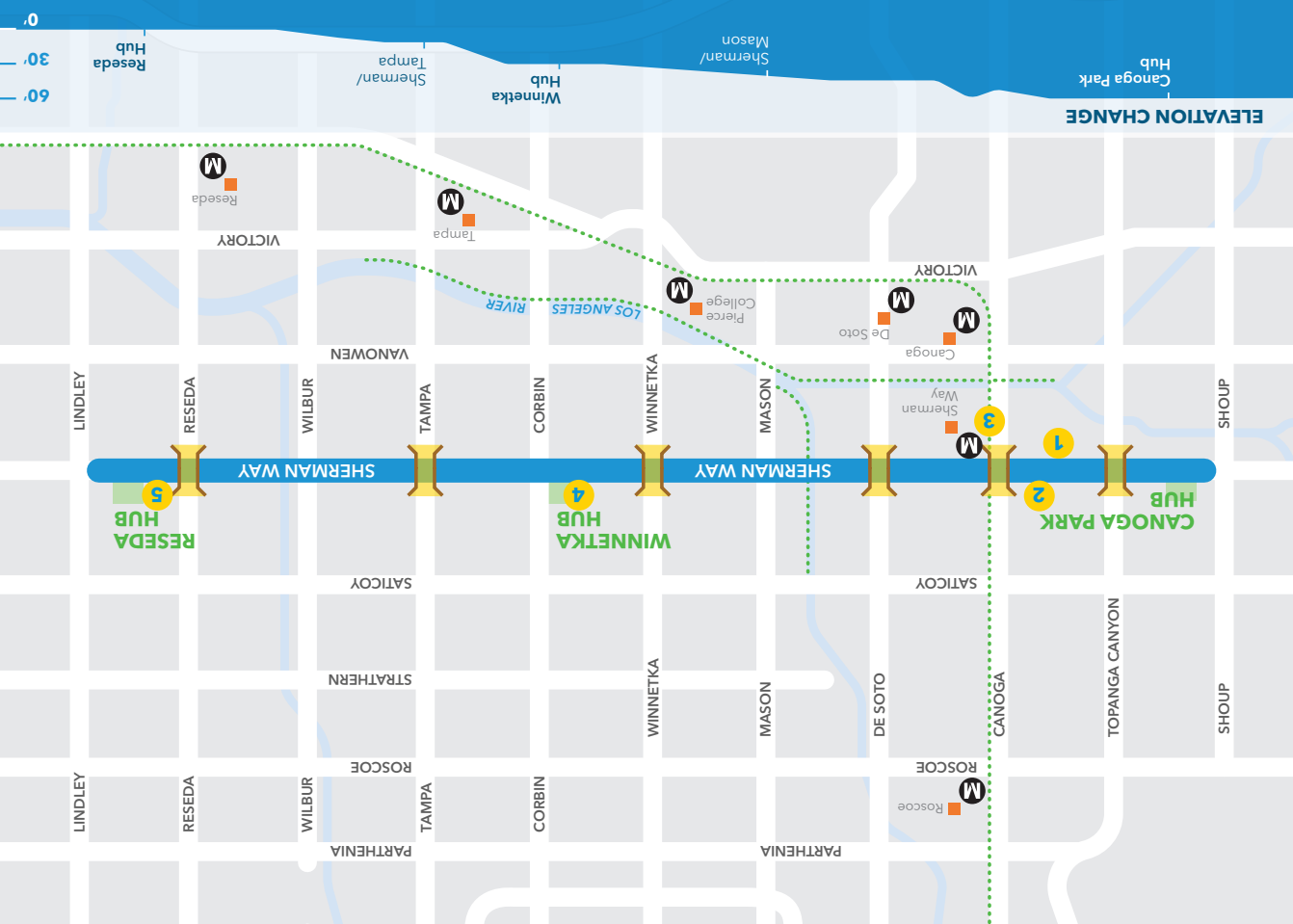

CANOGA PARK HUB

Enjoy live music on the **Bob Blumenfield** stage, produced by 11:11 A Creative Collective. See Dr. Madd VIBE and the Missin’ Links, Astral Jubilee, Chola Orange, and Mind Monogram!

Stop by the **REI Co-op** activation and climb the rock pinnacle, take a selfie at their fun photo wall, and enter a prize wheel sweepstakes for a spin at some cool swag and a raffle prize. They’ll have a little surprise and delight for you too, but you’ll have to visit their booth to find out what it is!

Relax in the **AARP** play zone while catching up over vintage board games.

Plug into the phone charging station at the **LADWP Solar Trailer** and let the sun repower your phone.

Complete the **kids bike safety skills** course and get a free helmet (while supplies last) courtesy of CicLAvia.

Learn basic skateboarding skills with the **Skateside**.

Check out the latest bikes from **Pure Cycles**.

Sign up for a **free LA Public Library card** and look for the roaming Book Bike distributing free books to people with library cards.

“A Better Bike Equals a Better World” Printmaking with Canoga Park Youth Arts Center. Participants will use the traditional medium of **block printing** to create their own print. Attendees are encouraged to design a fantasy bike, scooter or other mode of transportation by drawing and creating a plate to be printed.

NEAR THE HUB

Refuel on creativity and good vibes at the **UNITE Cultural Center** at 21710 Sherman Way with your local neighborhood hip hop heads and community heroes **The GR818ERS** (pronounced ‘great-one-eighters’). Drop by their newly opened home base to get down to some music, create your next masterpiece, and enjoy GR8 company.



WINNETKA HUB

Grab a bite at some of LA’s best **food trucks**.

Stop by the **Walk ‘n Rollers** Creation Station. Unleash your inner artist with family friendly activities including custom button making, spoke card and race plate design, and helmet decorating!

Enjoy story time at the top of each hour, hosted by **First 5 LA**. Receive a free bike bell for your child (5 and under), while supplies last.

Breastfeeding and Diaper Changing Station brought to you by **First 5 LA**.

Does your child need a helmet? Stop by the **California Highway Patrol** booth and get fitted for a free kids helmet (while supplies last).

RESEDA HUB

Stop by the Great Streets **Tarzana Crossing** booth to see potential streetscape improvements coming near the Orange Line. Learn about ways to get involved with Tarzana Crossing and participate in some fun games!

Check out the latest in folding bikes from **TERN**.

Stop by the **LA County Registrar** booth to make sure you’re registered to vote!

LADOT’s Vision Zero and **Active Transportation Divisions** will be sharing information about their projects in the Valley, including new on-street bikeways, safety upgrades, streetscape improvements, and an expanded LA River path! Take a minute to learn about what’s planned and under construction, provide feedback, and share your visions for some of the Valley’s major corridors as we work to make LA’s streets more livable.

VOLTA by Cirque de Soleil is coming to Los Angeles! Stop by their ticket kiosk and take a selfie.

NEAR THE HUB

LOCAL GEMS ALONG AND NEAR THE ROUTE

Madrid Theatre

21622 Sherman Way

Madrid Theatre is a state-of-the-art performance facility for professional, community, and student productions. It includes an expansive exhibit space for visual artists, and an arena for Madrid Theatre productions.
- 2

Antique Row

Sherman Way, between Owensmouth Ave and Alabama Ave

Across from Madrid Theatre is Antique Row, a series of brick buildings from the 1920s and 1930s (that survived the Northridge earthquake). It’s a destination spot for rare antiques.

Orange Line Bikeway

Along the Metro Orange Line Busway

Starting (or ending) on the Orange Line Bikeway gives cyclists roughly an additional 15 miles of protected riding with hidden LA scenery, including leafy canopies and artists’ murals. This bike route runs along the Metro Orange Line and provides a safe, traffic-free means of traversing the heart of the San Fernando Valley.

The Victorian

19725 Sherman Way

Near the Winnetka Hub is a Valley oddity: The Victorian, a 75-foot tall Queen Anne-style building that was painstakingly constructed out of salvaged pieces (windows, staircases, balustrades) of similar buildings in Bunker Hill.

Reseda Theater

18443 Sherman Way

The Reseda Theater is a subject of redevelopment (known as Reseda Rising) to maintain the iconic theater marquee and revitalize its role in the commercial district.

- ### Aerojet Rocketdyne

8900 De Soto Ave

The Aerojet Rocketdyne building is home to incredible achievements in rocket science, as well as some creative outdoor art.

Valley Relics Museum

7900 Balboa Blvd

Off the route, The Valley Relics Museum (open Sundays 11am–3pm), is a large space—it occupies two entire airplane hangars at Van Nuys Airport—sporting tens of thousands of vintage signs, costumes, vehicles, and other memorabilia.

Sepulveda Basin Recreation Area

17017 Burbank Blvd

The Sepulveda Basin Recreation Area includes 2,000 acres of public parks and sports facilities—home to dozens of Valley sights. The Sepulveda Dam, built in 1941, sits at the edge of the Basin (at what was, at the time, the end of Los Angeles city limits) and near the Wildlife Preserve, replete with nature paths and hiking trails.

Lake Balboa Park

6300 Balboa Blvd

Lake Balboa Park comprises 80 acres at the center of the Basin, offering boat rides and fishing.

Japanese Garden

6100 Woodley Ave

In the northeast corner of the Basin lies the Japanese Garden (open Sundays from 10am to 4pm, though check details on their site); it’s known as a “garden of water and fragrance.”
