How Political Rhetoric Inflames

- At the highest levels of elected office, Covid-19 has been racialized as a "Chinese virus"
- From March 2020 to 2022, Stop AAPI Hate received over 11,000 reports of hate incidents against AAPIs nationwide
- As of early 2022, about 20% of Americans believed Asian Americans are at least partially responsible for Covid-19 (STAATUS Index)
- In November 2022, TX S.B. 147 proposed to ban Chinese, as well as Iranians, North Koreans, and Russians who are not U.S. citizens from owning land
- In February 2023, Rep. Lance Gooden (R-TX) questioned the "loyalty and competence" of Rep. Judy Chu (D-CA), Chairwoman of the Congressional **APA Caucus**

A Toisan-born grandfather in his eighties explained that he and his wife lived daily, fearing they would be deported due to anti-immigrant rhetoric and misinformation. Usually an active person, he did not leave his apartment for weeks, spent countless nights without sleep, and started experiencing dizziness.

In April 2022, an Asian woman elder and resident of Massachusetts for nearly fifty years was approached from the side and punched in the face while leaving a bakery in Boston's Chinatown.




