
Luminary Decorating Party 2023 Sunday, January 8th, 3-5 pm, Monella Community Center, 133 Fairview Avenue, South Orange

The Luminary Project



MLK Day Canned Food Collection...it's back!







The MERT Committee of the Community Coalition on Race presented its 2022 Demographics Report to the community. Updating previous reports from 2016 and 2019 that relied on 2010 the US Census and subsequent American Community Survey polls, the report focusses on racial integration and diversity trends in
