LEGISLATIVE UPDATE FEBRUARY 10, 2024

SB 189 Text portions of ballots shall be counted for vote tabulation

The text portion of the paper ballot marked and printed by the electronic ballot marker indicating the elector's selection shall constitute the official ballot and shall constitute the official vote for purposes of vote tabulation, any recount conducted pursuant to 21-2-495, and any audit conducted pursuant to 21-2-498. The official tabulation count of any ballot scanner shall be based upon the text portion or the machine mark, provided that such mark clearly denotes the elector's selection and does not use a QR code, bar code, or similar coding, of such ballots and not any machine coding that may be printed on such ballots."

SB 355 Prohibit the Use of Ranked-Choice Voting

Ranked-choice voting shall not be used in determining the election or nomination of any candidate to any local, state, or federal office.

This Code section shall not apply to electors who are entitled to vote absentee ballot under the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act..

SB 358 Remove the Secretary of State from the State Election Board

"With the approval of the board, (the executive director may) employ and fix the compensation of personnel, <u>including investigators</u>, as determined necessary to assist the executive director in his or her duties."

Add to the SEB duties the investigation of the administration of primary and election laws by the Secretary of State and local election officials.

<u>SB 332</u> Prosecuting Attorneys Qualifications Commission; promulgate standards of conduct and rules for the commission's governance

Remove the wording that requires that the standards and rules shall be effective only upon review and adoption by the Supreme Court.

HB 974 SOS make scanned ballot images available to the public

Scanned images created by the voting system shall have a resolution of no less than 200 dpi. Scanned ballot images shall be maintained for no less than 24 months.

"(g) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, including, but not limited to, the certification requirement in paragraph (3) of subsection (a) of Code Section 21-2-300, all absentee ballots tabulated pursuant to this Code section shall be scanned so that there is a digital image of each such ballot. All such scans shall have a resolution of no less than 600 dots per inch, or the highest resolution possible within the certified voting system. All such scans shall be posted and maintained by the program provided for in subsection (j.1) of Code Section 21-2-493."

Decrease the number of weekday advanced voting from 15 to 10 days, starting from the third Thursday before the primary or election and ending the Wednesday prior to the election.
