HB 977 Number of contests subject to risk-limiting audits

Expand the number of contests subject to risk-limiting audits to contests at the top of the ballot AND one of each:

United States Senate, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State

School Superintendent, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Agriculture,

Commissioner of Labor, Supreme Court Justice, Judge of the Court of Appeals, or

Public Service Commissioner

Original provision reduced from auditing 7 races to auditing 2 by RLA

Provide for percentages of risk limits, lowering the risk limit percentages Provide procedures for selection of contests subject to risk-limiting audits

SB 392 / HB 986 Criminalize deep fake interference

A BILL to establish the criminal offense of election interference with a deep fake and solicitation of such; to provide for definitions; to provide for exceptions; to provide for punishment; to provide for the State Election Board to publish results of investigations into such offenses; to provide for legislative findings; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

Protection against the use of deep fake materials in bad faith to significantly influence elections by reducing certain candidates' chances of being elected or by suppressing voter turnout through mass confusion.

HB 1112 Remove Secretary of State from State Election Board; attach SEB to State Accounting Office

By: Representatives Leverett of the 123rd, LaHood of the 175th, Barrett of the 24th, Anderson of the 10th, Horner of the 3rd, and Ridley of the 22nd https://www.legis.ga.gov/legislation/66576

- remove the Secretary of State from the State Election Board
- provide that the board shall be administratively attached to the State Accounting Office
- provide for the hiring and qualifications of investigators; so as to authorize the board to investigate the election division of the Secretary of State's office
- to authorize the board to issue letters of instruction and letters of reprimand; to provide for circumstances when such letters are appropriate

SB 367 Eliminate authorization of ballot drop boxes

A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to primaries and elections generally, so as to eliminate authorization for the use of ballot drop boxes

Repealing subsection (c) of Code Section 21-2-382, relating to additional buildings as additional registrar's office or place of registration for receiving absentee ballots and for advance voting and drop boxes.

SB 368 Government Transparency and Campaign Finance; Prohibit foreign nationals from contributing to candidates or campaign committees

By: Senators Williams of the 25th, Burns of the 23rd, Dolezal of the 27th, Robertson of the 29th, Strickland of the 17th and 5 others https://www.legis.ga.gov/legislation/66138

- to prohibit foreign nationals from contributing to candidates or campaign committees
- to prohibit candidates and campaign committees from accepting contributions from foreign nationals
- to require agents of foreign principals to register with the State Ethics Commissioner
- to require agents of foreign principals to disclose to government agencies and the General Assembly when such
 agents are advocating on behalf of a foreign principal

HB 1191 Repeal unlimited funding to leadership committees for affecting the outcome of any election

- repeal provisions of law regarding leadership committees (OCGA 21-5-34.2 Governor, Lt. Governor, GA Assembly majority and minority leaders)
- provide for the termination of current leadership committees
- provide for the disposition of funds held by such committees by December 31, 2024
- provide for certain registration and reports

HB 1256 Hand marked but machine scanned uniform elections like Kari Lake's 2022 stolen election

By: Representatives Park of the 107th, Roberts of the 52nd, Holcomb of the 81st, Clark of the 108th, and Hugley of the 141st https://www.legis.ga.gov/legislation/66966

- Effective May 1, 2024 elections conducted by scanning ballots marked by electronic ballot markers hand by pen or other writing instrument
- Electronic BMD's optional at voters' request as accessibility units
- Certified electronic voting system shall have all software and hardware updates
- "(a) The superintendent of each county or municipality shall order the proper programming, as provided by the Secretary of State, to be placed in each ballot scanner used in any precinct or central tabulating location.
- Any 10 electors may request the examination of a device specifically identify the concerns that are to be addressed and pay to the Secretary of State the reasonable expenses of such examination or reexamination, which shall not exceed \$5,000.00.
- public access to the voting system ballot images not less than two days prior to the county election certification.
- Manual recounts under certain conditions
