

Minneapolis police shoot, wound man armed with handgun

A Minneapolis police officer shot and wounded a man who emerged from a car car-rying a gun in a north Minneapolis neighborhood around

noon Wednesday, police said.

The man, whose name wasn't released, was taken to North Memorial Medical Center in Robbinsdale with non-life-threatening injuries, police said. The officers at the scene were placed on a rou-tine administrative leave

while police investigate.

Police said they were responding to a disturbance call on the 2200 block of N. 4th St. and found four men sitting in a car and questioned them. When officers asked the men to get out of the car, three complied and one in the back seat hesitated, even after po-lice shouted at him to get out, police said. When he came out, officer Paul Gillies saw out, officer Paul Gillies saw him carrying a handgun and yelled "gun" to warn officer Cheryl Kassa. The man did not drop his weapon, and Gillies fired, police said. Sgt. Medaria Arradondo said it was unknown Wednes-day whether officers had told the man to drop his gun. The man was hit at least

The man was hit at least twice, including once in the arm, police Inspector Tim Dolan said. Police said they found a second gun in the group. It was unclear whether anyone in the car had fired. Tyrone Union, who said he

was the wounded man's cousin, said he was watching from a house on the block and saw his cousin tell officers about the gun and then put it on the ground in front of him. The officer fired anyway, he said.

Union also said there was no reason for officers to approach the car.

"He was minding his own business, sitting in the car," Union said. He said he didn't know why the men were in the car, however.
Police Chief Robert Olson

went to the scene in the Haw-thorne neighborhood, where Union and about a dozen oth-

ers stood by. Olson lauded the neighborhood resident who called

police.
"What are these four guys and two guns, what are they up to in this neighborhood at 12 noon?" Olson asked.

"You just don't come out of

"You just don't come out of cars carrying guns on police officers," Olson said. He said the three others in the car were taken in for ques-tioning and released tioning and released.
