by Simmons. He told police his 1965 Buick Riviera was missing, and \$150 was gone from his wallet.

Acting on a tip relayed by Lt. Pat Hartigan of the robbery division, Kiely and Schultz drove to an apartment at 713 Emerson Av. N. about 6:30 p.m. and spotted the missing car.

When the two officers saw a man fitting Simmons' description sitting in the front seat they drove past the car, stopped and got out.

Schultz said he raised his gun and yelled, "We're police — get your hands up." He said the suspect looked at the officers, swung his feet out of the car and raised a .38-caliber revolver and began shooting at them.

**THE TWO** officers returned the fire, and Schultz emptied his revolver. The suspect ran from the car toward the apartment building. Two other squads of uniformed police arrived and fired several shots at the suspect as he ran, according to police.

Schultz said he yelled to the suspect, "Stop shooting, there are children in the area." He said Simmons replied, "Get away from me — leave me alone."

Simmons fell to the pavement shot twice in the right leg, once in the right arm, once in the buttocks and once in the right armpit, police said.

As one of the officers searched Simmons, the suspect yelled to a crowd that was gathering that he was being robbed by the police, Schultz said.

A .38-caliber revolver found at the scene had five rounds fired, police said. Simmons, who police said was a parole violator, also was wanted in connection with a Sept. 5 robbery of the L&R Bike Shop, 2548 Nicollet Av.
