Build the Wall, Secure the Border

RESOLUTION 3

WHEREAS, the state of New York recently made abortion up to the moment of birth legal; and

WHEREAS, the Democratic Governor of the State of Virginia, Ralph Northam, said regarding a similar bill proposed by Democrats in the Virginia legislature *“If a mother is in labor, I can tell you exactly what would happen. The infant would be delivered. The infant would be kept comfortable. The infant would be resuscitated if that’s what the mother and the family desired. RESOLUTION

Appoint the State Secretary of Education
