

Tips for February 13 Valentine's Day Action

If you are one (1) person

1. Bring two or three Valentine's cards with you into the restaurant.
2. Place your order.
3. In a loud, but friendly, voice present the card to the worker:
 - You can explain that we are giving them some Valentine's Day Love.
 - That we appreciate the work of all the staff of Tim Hortons.
 - You can say you're part of the Fight for \$15 and Fairness and that you want them and all workers to be treated fairly.
 - Let them know that the card contains information from the Ministry of Labour about our new legal rights. Legally, employers are supposed to give the information to all their workers.
 - Thank them and wish them a happy Valentine's Day.
4. Tip them if you can.

OPTIONAL:

5. If you had flowers or chocolates or other "friendly" gift(s) to give them, that's a bonus.
6. If you have some of the flyers with more information about the situation with Tim Hortons (including profits) try to leaflet the customers on your way out.

If you go in a group of two (2) or more

1. Each person could bring two or three Valentine's cards into the restaurant, and some leaflets with background information
2. Two people could go together to place an order. If you are being rushed, one person can present and explain the Valentine's Day card, while the other person takes their time counting out the payment in small change which could give the other person time to address the workers (as above).
3. Tip them if you can.

4. As you leave with your order, try to have one person or a few people leaflet the customers with the flyers containing information about the situation with Tim Hortons (including profits).

OPTIONAL:

5. If you had flowers or chocolates or other "friendly" gift to give the workers, that's a bonus.

If you go through a drive-through

1. Place your order.
2. When you are at the window to receive your order and pay, present the card to the worker.
 - You can explain that we are giving them some Valentine's Day Love.
 - That we appreciate the work of all the staff of Tim Hortons.
 - You can say you're part of the Fight for \$15 and Fairness and that you want them and all workers to be treated fairly.
 - Let them know that the card contains information from the Ministry of Labour about our new legal rights. Legally, employers are supposed to give the information to all their workers.
 - Thank them and wish them a happy Valentine's Day.
3. Tip them if you can.

OPTIONAL:

4. If you had flowers or chocolates or other "friendly" gift to give them, that's a bonus.
