OFFICER REPORTS

The Chairman indicated he had produced 2 radio spots in support of the Court candidates which started October 16,2020 and will end November 3,2020. He attended the Trump Greenville Rally & drove a car in the Trump Truck Train and held a "Get-out-the-vote" phone pizza party at HQ.

1st Vice Chair, Paul Varcoe, indicated he volunteers at HQ, and has picked up signs in Willamston. He contacted and provided 75 names for inside poll workers to BC Board of Elections and will continue as an additional nine (9) republicans are needed. Letters will go out to these poll workers to verify their participation.

2nd Vice Chair, Joseph Knox, participated on the call for the State Executive Committee meeting. He reported the following Beaufort County voter registration:

Patricia Garrison also provided comments related to the State Executive Committee meeting. For example, the RNC has no debt with a \$502 M budget and was #1 in the nation for Win Red and in use of Social Media.

Secretary, Gail Breed, indicated there were 18 large TRUMP signs placed inside and outside of Washington with the material cost of \$32 per sign. Lorretta Adkins and husband donated the labor and install of each sign and coordinated with individual owners. One other donation came from the Women For Trump was a billboard on Rt 17. A motion and vote to approve the payment of \$482.41 was completed.

In support of get out the vote the following messages were sent to precinct officers on the following topics:

- Signs taken to the four early voting sites
- Signs for Nov 3 polling locations set up and ready for pick up with palm cards

The secretary is also precinct chair for Washington W2 and reported a Get Out the Vote phone party was completed with republicans and most unaffiliated called. Additionally, door to door for Main St, 2nd St and Washington HRBR
