New North Carolina Laws that took effect on July 1, 2023.

'Guarantee 2nd Amendment Freedom and Protections' This repeals the state's requirement to obtain a pistol purchase permit prior to the purchase or transfer of a handgun. The law also allows people who have a concealed handgun permit, or who are exempt from obtaining that permit, to carry a handgun into a place of religious worship that is also an educational facility.

"The Abortion Bill" Care for Women, Children, and Families Act' Prohibits abortions after 12 weeks, with exceptions: up to 20 weeks for rape and incest, up to 24 weeks for "life-limiting" fetal anomalies, and without limit if a physician determines that the mother's life is in danger due to a medical emergency.

Rulings from the US Supreme Court

The US Supreme Court ruled that UNC-Chapel Hill's race-conscious undergraduate admissions policy is a violation of the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. Two lawsuits argued that admissions policies taking race into consideration discriminate against Asian American applicants and, in the case of UNC, also white students. *Raleigh News and Observer*
