
# July Fireworks Guidelines July 3rd 2023 - 9:30pm



# On The Water

- 1. All participants must meet the following basic requirements.
  - Have a properly registered, motor-driven, vessel capable of safe travel in Oregon waters.
  - The vessel operator must have a State Boater Safety Card.
  - c. It is illegal to operate a boat while under the influence of alcohol; vessels should have a designated operator who refrains from alcoholic consumption.
  - d. The vessel must meet all requirements for on-board safety equipment, including sufficient life jackets for all on board.
  - e. All vessels must be lit with nighttime running lights as described in (OAR 250-12-xxxx). Note this includes PWC's, human powered craft, and paddle board.
- 2. Fireworks will be ignited from a barge floating in the middle of the lake just east of Brown Bear State Park.
- 3. A 300 foot exclusion zone will be enforced around the perimeter of the fireworks barge. Do not enter this zone.
- 4. Do not use Fireworks while in a vessel on the lake.
- 5. While navigating to show, maintain a SLOW speed to minimize your wake.
- 6. Please allow an adequate amount of spacing between boats as you select your viewing location.
- Do not overcrowd your boat with participants, by exceeding your vessel's posted occupancy sticker. Every child under the age of 13 MUST have a life jacket while on deck and be in a secure location on the vessel.

- 8. Because of the large volume of boat traffic on the lake as well and the nighttime conditions special precautions should be used in PWC's, human powered craft, and paddle boards.
  - a. Please stay close to shore when traveling to and from the event.
  - b. Proper lighting and signal devices are required, you will be escorted from the lake if you do not meet these requirements.
  - c. Wear a life jacket, it's a small precaution that could save your life.
  - d. For safety reasons, we have recommended two areas one on each side of the lake for human powered craft to gather, near Regatta Park, and Brown Bear State Park.
  - e. At the conclusion of the show, wait for motorized traffic to disperse before proceeding to your slip, berth or boat ramp.



- 9. At the end of the fireworks show or if you should exit early please continue slowly returning to your slip, or boat launch. Note that there will be a large number of boats on the lake at this time all generating wakes, this can cause unsafe conditions and damage to private property. PLEASE BE AWARE OF NON-MOTORIZED VESSELS THAT MAY BE ON THE LAKE.
- 10. In General, please use common sense, be respectful of other parade participants, and be respectful of other boaters. Be Safe, Have Fun and Enjoy the show! Thanks for making it happen!

### On The Land

The Oregon State Fire Marshal recommends that you promote and practice the 4 BE'S to protect your family from fireworks related fires & injuries.

#### BE RESPONSIBLE:

- Soak used fireworks thoroughly in a bucket of water.
- Dispose of used fireworks & debris properly.
- Never re-light "dud" fireworks. Wait 15-20 minutes then soak it in a bucket of water

# BE PREPARED:

- Store fireworks out of children's reach.
- Always read and follow label directions.
- Place pets indoors; they're easily frightened by fireworks.
- Always have water handy (a garden hose or a bucket of water).

# BE SAFE:

- An adult should always light fireworks.
- Keep matches & lighters away from children.
- Use fireworks outdoors only.
- Light only one firework at a time & move away quickly.
- Keep children & pets away from fireworks.
- Always remember-do not throw fireworks or hold them in your hand.

#### BE AWARE:

- Use only legal fireworks.
- Use fireworks only in legal places
- Fireworks are prohibited on all beaches, State Parks, & State or Federal Forest lands.
