Learning Conservation Leadership at the Deanery

The Deanery Project is hosting two new Canadian Conservation Corps interns from Alberta this fall, Maddie Lee and Teagan Melnyk, continuing commitment involving Canadian youth in conservation work. The Canadian Conservation Corps and other fully funded programs Ocean Bridge connect Canadians under thirty to conservation projects.

CCC participants between 18 and 30 start the program by taking part in a two-week-long wilderness expedition. This adventure forms deep connections within the group, building soft skills like group management and hard skills like map and compass navigation. They build meaningful connections to the land and gain a deeper understanding of their impact on the natural world.

After this two-week expedition, interns take their new leadership skills into organizations where

they get hands-on-conservation experience. The Deanery Project resides on the traditional land of the Mi'kmaq people. As interns, Lee and Melnyk will be immersed in the organization's unique "living

laboratory" combining art, permaculture, natural building, music, and celebrations like the annual Sealight Skylight festival. The Deanery Project's interdisciplinary approach to sustainability cultivates community and allows individuals from widely varied walks of life to become involved in collaborative conservation projects that have a lasting impact on the community.

Following their work at the Deanery Project, Lee and Melnyk will develop and implement a project in their home communities. In these projects, they will apply the skills, experience, and connection they have gathered and work to inspire other young people to get involved in this important work.
