Information provided is to be limited to a maximum of one A4 page as it will be distributed to members prior to the AGM. In addition to the Nominee Statement that will be distributed to members, please provide the name and contact details of two referees.

This Nominee Statement needs to be received by the ECNT at least 5 business days before the AGM.

Note – Irrespective of whether a Nominee Statement is received and distributed, each Nominee will have an opportunity to speak briefly to members prior to voting at the AGM.



Attachment 1

NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA ASSOCIATIONS ACT 2003

As in force at 29 September 2021

Extract:

30 Certain persons not to be members of committee etc.

- (1) A person who is an insolvent under administration or a disqualified person must not, without leave of the Commissioner, be an officer of an incorporated association.

Maximum penalty: 200 penalty units.

- (2) A person who has been convicted within or outside the Territory:

- (a) on an indictment of an offence in connection with the promotion, formation or management of a body corporate; or
- (b) of an offence involving fraud or dishonesty punishable on conviction by imprisonment for not less than 3 months; or
- (c) of an indictable offence; or
- (d) of an offence against this Act; or
- (e) a prescribed offence;

must not, within 5 years after the conviction or, if the person was sentenced to imprisonment in relation to the offence, within 5 years after release from custody, without leave of the Commissioner, be an officer of an incorporated association.

Maximum penalty: 200 penalty units.

- (3) Subsection (2) applies even if the conviction or release from custody occurred before the commencement of this Act.
- (4) When granting leave under this section, the Commissioner may impose the conditions the Commissioner considers appropriate.
- (5) The Commissioner may revoke leave granted under this section.
- (6) In this section:

insolvent under administration means a person who:

- (a) under the *Bankruptcy Act 1966* (Cth), is a bankrupt in relation to a bankruptcy from which the person is not discharged; or
- (b) under the law of a country other than Australia, has the status of an undischarged bankrupt; and includes:
- (c) a person who has executed a personal insolvency agreement under Part X of the *Bankruptcy Act 1966* (Cth) or the corresponding provisions of the law of another country, in either case if the terms of the deed have not been fully complied with; and
- (d) a person whose creditors have accepted a composition under Part X of the *Bankruptcy Act 1966* (Cth) or the corresponding provisions of the law of another country, in either case if a final payment has not been made under that composition.



From the ECNT Constitution:

1. Name

The name of the Association is the Environment Centre (NT) Incorporated (in these rules called "the Centre")

2. Objects

The objects of the Centre are:

- (1) The protection of all aspects of the natural environment;
- (2) To initiate and carry out specific campaigns aimed at securing the protection of the natural environment;
- (3) To sponsor and carry out research on matters relating to the environment;
- (4) To educate and inform the public on environmental issues;
- (5) To maintain a permanent space to carry out the objects of the Centre;
- (6) To encourage and support individuals, environmental and other organisations and governments to help in achieving our objects;
- (7) To act as spokespersons on environmental issues;
- (8) To do all such things that are conducive to the achievement of the above objects; and
- (9) To maintain independence from all political parties.
