### A LANDMARK ELECTION

Ottawa's landmark election will be pivotal in determining the future of the City of Ottawa and the well-being of its residents for years to come.

- On October 24, citizens will choose not only a new mayor, but also a whole set of new City Council members, effectively changing the face of the government of our nation's capital.
- There exist many possible futures based on who is elected. Some candidates embrace bold ambition on climate and justice, as we know science demands. Some candidates plan to reinforce the status quo, which we can plainly see is crumbling under our feet with climate, housing, and inequity crises that are well underway.
- With this election, we have the power to choose those candidates who will take bold environmental action. In doing so, we can help make our city more liveable, green, and just, and to refuse climate breakdown and instead choose a resilient climate future for Ottawa.
- As our nation's capital, Ottawa must show bold, creative environmental leadership and serve as a model for cities around the country and the world, while improving the well-being of individuals, communities, and the environment.





### ABOUT THE SURVEY

Ecology Ottawa's All-Candidates Survey on the Environment helps voters understand where candidates stand on the environment. This is a comprehensive, multi-issue survey that digs deep on climate commitments with those vying for leadership.

- Every Mayoral and City Council candidate in the 2022 Ottawa municipal election was invited to participate in the survey.
- More than 70 candidates weighed in on 13 questions on a range of critical issues, including energy, housing, public transit, bike lanes, the tree canopy, Indigenous partnership, justice, equity, diversity and inclusion, and more.
- We have also included questions on waste management in partnership with local advocacy group Waste Watch Ottawa.
- Candidates responded to each question with a yes or no answer, and were provided with the opportunity to elaborate on their response with more context in a long answer.
- Not all "yes" or "no" answers are equal. Candidates might reply with a yes, but a closer reading of their long answer reveals whether their commitment is resolute, or whether they might lack the political will to follow through on tough but important decisions.
- The devil is in the details, so voters are highly encouraged to go beyond the "yes" and "no" answers to read the long answers and see where candidates stand.





### OVERVIEW OF RESULTS

The survey results show that while there is growing consensus on some issues, there still exists division on critical issues. We believe stronger environmental policies always come with high economic and social benefits, and that we need courageous candidates that will rise to meet the precarious moment at which we find ourselves.

- What emerges through the responses is that environment and climate are front and centre in this campaign, and candidates are keenly aware that there is no path to leadership without a strong climate plan. Whether candidates follow through once elected is the big question and the long answers in this survey give some clues.
- Some of the survey answers showed stark differences of opinion, such as phasing out of fossil fuels which science tells us needs to be done with the utmost urgency. For other questions, like reducing waste, there was widespread agreement on the goal but different approaches to how to realize them.
- And of course, expressing a commitment on the campaign trail does not necessarily mean action once elected. Candidates are working to earn votes, and they know that across the entire city, Ottawans are deeply concerned about the environment.





### OVERVIEW OF RESULTS

- 85% of respondents said they would fully fund and implement the City of Ottawa's ambitious Energy Evolution plan, and 87% said they would commit to no expansions of the urban boundary - though these commitments waver in some of the candidates' long answers.
- The strongest consensus over 90% came through on climate adaptation, active transit networks, conservation, collecting organic waste, restoring the tree canopy, and working in partnership with Algonquin Anishinaabe and other Indigenous people. For each question, there were details about meaningful commitments that would need to be fulfilled, such as changing relevant by-laws.
- Two questions saw a surprising 100% consensus. The first is committing to building a public transit system that is rapid, reliable, affordable and accessible for all users, with proper transit routes within rural, suburban and lower income communities. The second is bringing Ottawans at all diversity intersections together on environmental issues.
- The most division on any question was around waste management. Asked whether they would support the introduction of a user-pay system for curbside residual waste collection, 56% supported the idea while the rest did not. Amongst both those that agreed and disagreed with the idea, many expressed concern about passing costs along to citizens with the rise of inflation.





### CALL TO ACTION


Citizens have incredible power to determine the outcome of this election. Here are four actions you can take to help shape the future of Ottawa:


























