# **BRITISH COLUMBIA**

### AN EQUAL VOICE PROVINCE SNAPSHOT, 2025

British Columbia (B.C.) has had two women premiers and was the second province or territory in Canada to achieve gender parity in its legislature, with at least half of its MLAs being women. The Legislative Assembly of B.C. seats 93 members, of which 49 are women (52.7%). B.C.'s last election took place in October 2024

### **GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE**

B.C. has a unicameral legislature, with one chamber: the **Legislative Assembly of British Columbia**. As a parliamentary democracy, B.C. has 93 constituencies which are each represented by an elected **Member of the Legislative Assembly** (MLA).

The political party with the most elected MLAs forms government, and their leader becomes the head of government, called the **Premier**. The Premier selects MLAs to serve as Cabinet Ministers.

The Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia is appointed by the Governor General of Canada and represents the King, Canada's Head of State.

Iona Campagnolo was the first woman to be appointed Lieutenant Governor of B.C.

### 2017

B.C. had the longest-serving woman premier in Canada. Christy Clark served for over six years from 2011-2017.

# 2024

B.C. was the second Canadian province or territory to have a women-majority legislature (52.7% women), following the Northwest Territories in 2021.
