

NEW BRUNSWICK

AN EQUAL VOICE PROVINCE SNAPSHOT, 2025

New Brunswick (N.B.) has had one woman premier, and its legislature has not yet achieved gender parity by having women make up at least half of its MLAs. The Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick seats 49 members, of which 17 are women (34.7%). N.B.'s last election took place in October 2024.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

N.B. has a unicameral legislature, with one chamber: the **Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick**. As a parliamentary democracy, N.B. has 49 constituencies which are each represented by an elected **Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA)**.

The political party with the most elected MLAs forms government, and their leader becomes the head of government, called the **Premier**. The Premier selects MLAs to serve as Cabinet Ministers.

The **Lieutenant Governor of New Brunswick** is appointed by the Governor General of Canada and represents the King, Canada's Head of State.

N.B.'s 2024 election saw a record number of women win seats in the province's legislature, with 17 women MLAs out of 49 (34.7%). This is the highest proportion of women MLAs in N.B.'s history.
