## **NORTHWEST TERRITORIES**

#### AN EQUAL VOICE PROVINCE SNAPSHOT, 2025

Northwest Territories (N.W.T.) has had two women premiers and was the first province or territory in Canada to achieve gender parity in its legislature, with at least half of its MLAs being women. The N.W.T. Legislative Assembly seats 19 members, of which 8 are women (42.1%). N.W.T.'s last election took place in November 2023.

#### GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

The N.W.T. has a unicameral legislature, with one chamber: the **Northwest Territories Legislative Assembly**. As a parliamentary democracy, the Northwest Territories has 19 constituencies which are each represented by an elected **Member of the Legislative Assembly** (MLA).

The Northwest Territories uses a **consensus government** system, in which there are no political parties, and all MLAs are elected as independents. After a general election, MLAs select from among themselves a **Premier** and Cabinet Ministers, who form government.

The Commissioner of the Northwest Territories is appointed by the Government of Canada and represents the federal government in the territory.

## **MILESTONES**

#### 1970

Lena Pedersen was the first woman to be elected to the N.W.T. Council, a body which later became the N.W.T. Legislative Assembly.



#### 1991

N.W.T. was the first Canadian territory to be led by a woman premier with Nellie Cournoyea. Cournoyea was also the second woman to serve as premier in all of Canada, after Rita Johnston in B.C.



#### 1995

Helen Maksagak was the first woman to serve as Commissioner of the N.W.T.



#### 1999

The former N.W.T. was divided into two territories - Nunavut and a new N.W.T.



#### 2021

N.W.T. became the first Canadian province or territory to have a women-majority legislature, with 10 women MLAs out of 19 (52.6%)
