AN EQUAL VOICE PROVINCE SNAPSHOT, 2025

Nova Scotia (N.S.) has not yet had a woman premier, and its legislature has not yet achieved gender parity by having women make up at least half of its MLAs. The Nova Scotia House of Assembly seats 55 members, of which 20 are women and gender diverse people (36.4%). N.S.'s last election took place in November 2024.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

N.S. has a unicameral legislature, with one chamber: the Nova Scotia House of Assembly. As a parliamentary democracy, N.S. has 55 constituencies which are each represented by an elected Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA).

The political party with the most elected MLAs forms government, and their leader becomes the head of government, called the **Premier**. The Premier selects MLAs to serve as Cabinet Ministers.

The Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia is appointed by the Governor General of Canada and represents the King, Canada's Head of State.

2021

N.S.'s 2021 election saw a record number of women and gender diverse people win seats in the province's legislature, with 20 women and gender diverse MLAs out of 55 (36.4%). This is the highest proportion of women and gender diverse MLAs in Nova Scotia's history, tied with the results of the 2024 election.
