AN EQUAL VOICE PROVINCE SNAPSHOT, 2025

Québec (Que.) has had one woman premier, and its legislature came very close to achieving gender parity when women made up nearly half of its MNAs. The National Assembly of Québec seats 125 members, of which 57 are women (46%). Que.'s last election took place in October 2022.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

Que. has a unicameral legislature, with one chamber: the National Assembly of Québec. As a parliamentary democracy, Que. has 125 constituencies which are each represented by an elected Member of the National Assembly (MNA).

The political party with the most elected MNAs forms government, and their leader becomes the head of government, called the **Premier**. The Premier selects MNAs to serve as Cabinet Ministers.

The Lieutenant Governor of Québec is appointed by the Governor General of Canada and represents the King, Canada's Head of State.

1951

Alta. was the first Canadian province or territory to elect women MLAs to its legislature. Louise McKinney and Roberta MacAdams Price were also the first women elected to a provincial legislature in the entire British Empire.
