AN EQUAL VOICE PROVINCE SNAPSHOT, 2025

Saskatchewan (Sask.) has not yet had a woman premier, nor has its legislature achieved gender parity by having women make up at least half of its MLAs. However, the current leader of the opposition is a woman (Carla Beck, Saskatchewan NDP). She is the third female opposition leader. The Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan seats 61 members, of which 21 are women (34.4%). Sask.'s last election took place in October 2024.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

Saskatchewan. has a unicameral legislature, with one chamber: the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan. As a parliamentary democracy, Sask. has 61 constituencies which are each represented by an elected Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA).

The political party with the most elected MLAs forms government, and their leader becomes the head of government, called the **Premier**. The Premier selects MLAs to serve as Cabinet Ministers.

The Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan is appointed by the Governor General of Canada and represents the King, Canada's Head of State.

Sarah Ramsland was the first woman MLA elected in Sask. No other women MLAs were elected in the province until 1944. .

Joan Duncan and Patricia Anne Smith were the first women named to Cabinet in Sask

Pat Smith was appointed Saskatchewan's first Minister Responsible for the Status of Women.

Sylvia Fedoruk was the first woman to be appointed Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan.



1989

Lynda Haverstock was the first woman to lead a Saskatchewan political party.



2024

Saskatchewan's 2024 election saw a record number of women win seats in the province's legislature, with 21 women MLAs out of 61 (34.4%). This is the highest proportion of women MLAs in Sask.'s history.
