AN EQUAL VOICE PROVINCE SNAPSHOT, 2025

Ontario (Ont.) has had one woman premier, and its legislature has not yet achieved gender parity by having women make up at least half of its MPPs. The Legislative Assembly of Ontario seats 124 members, of which 46 are women and gender diverse people (37.1%). Ont.'s last election took place in February 2025.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

Ont. has a unicameral legislature, with one chamber: the Legislative Assembly of Ontario. As a parliamentary democracy, Ont. has 124 constituencies which are each represented by an elected Member of Provincial Parliament (MPP).

The political party with the most elected MPPs forms government, and their leader becomes the head of government, called the **Premier**. The Premier selects MPPs to serve as Cabinet Ministers.

The Lieutenant Governor of Ontario is appointed by the Governor General of Canada and represents the King, Canada's Head of State.

MILESTONES

1902

Margaret Haile was the first woman to run in an Ont. provincial election. She did so despite women not yet being allowed to vote or sit in the Legislature at the time.

1943

Agnes Macphail and Rae Luckock were the first women MPPs elected in Ont.

Pauline McGibbon was the first woman to be appointed Lieutenant Governor of Ont. McGibbon was also the first woman to hold a viceregal position anywhere in Canada and the Commonwealth.



Zanana Akande was the first woman of colour MPP elected in Ont.

1992

Lyn McLeod was the first woman to lead an Ont. political party.

2013

Kathleen Wynne was the first woman premier of Ont. She was also the first openly gay premier in Canada.

2018

Ont.'s 2018 election saw a record number of women win seats in the province's legislature, with 49 women MPPs out of 124 (39.5%). This is the highest proportion of women MPPs in Ont.'s history.
