

# 25 simple things to do as a volunteer

1. Send your unique link to 3 friends and ask them to join [thistimeinvoting.eu](https://thistimeinvoting.eu)
2. Send an email to 3 colleagues asking them to join [thistimeinvoting.eu](https://thistimeinvoting.eu)
3. Talk about the upcoming elections at your next family gathering (e.g. tonight when you have dinner with them or during Sunday lunch).
4. Inform your friends about the election date and remind them to go and vote. You could do this waiting for your lecture to start, during a coffee break, at after-work drinks, on the way to the cinema...
5. Share information about the election date everywhere you go: leave flyers in your university cafeteria, on your colleagues' desks or in public spaces such as libraries, bars or trains. You can download flyers [here](#).
6. If you send postcards on holiday, add a little note reminding them of the Election Day.
7. Put a [thistimeinvoting](https://thistimeinvoting.eu) sticker on your phone cover, laptop, bike, bag, water bottle, diary... anywhere people will notice it! You can download stickers [here](#).
8. Put up a poster about the elections on your window for people to see. These could also be put up in your canteen, gym or favourite bar. Posters are available [here](#).
9. Tell your family and friends about the registration deadlines in your country.
10. Share factsheets on what Europe has done where you're from by using [www.what-europe-does-for-me.eu](https://www.what-europe-does-for-me.eu) and the Citizens' App.
11. Share your unique link on social media and include the date of the elections.
12. Add the [#thistimeinvoting](https://thistimeinvoting.eu) hashtag to post content about the elections on social media.
13. Share and promote [thistimeinvoting](https://thistimeinvoting.eu) events on your social media channels.
14. Choose a [thistimeinvoting](https://thistimeinvoting.eu) event to attend and invite 3 friends to go with you.

15. Join your local [thistimeinvoting](#) group on Facebook or WhatsApp and get in touch with other volunteers.
16. Ask your local European Parliament office if you can help them organise their next [thistimeinvoting](#) event.
17. Meet up with volunteers from your area and plan a [thistimeinvoting](#) activity together.
18. Promote [thistimeinvoting](#) on Messenger, Whatsapp, Viber or any other instant messaging apps you use.
19. Whenever you attend a public event (like a concert or pub quiz) bring some flyers or other election goodies to hand out. If you can (e.g. at the pub quiz) ask the organisers to mention the election date. For campaign material, visit this [link](#).
20. Have a go at creating your own election content to share on social media: Instagram stories, gifs, photos, testimonial videos... be creative!
21. Write a quick post on social media about why you will be voting in this year's elections.
22. Create and share a 'chain message' about the registration deadlines on WhatsApp, email or other instant messaging apps.
23. Send a message to your friends, colleagues or family members asking them to put the date of the elections in their calendars.
24. Bring 5 friends, colleagues and/or family members to vote with you on the Election Day.
25. Organise an Election Day event to make your friends go and vote with you. It could be a Sunday brunch, a barbecue, a visit to a museum, or anything that you and your friends enjoy!
